

NEXT YEAR'S PROGRAMS

Quilting friends: Your Program Committee has our plan in place for 2025-26. We are excited to announce our workshops for our upcoming year. We hope you will soon renew your membership if you have not yet done that, so that you are eligible to sign up and join the fun!

November 1, 2025

Heidi Proffetty will do a full day workshop of a Mini Poinsettia Mosaic Quilt Tile. At the end of the project, all that remains is to apply an accent binding and glitter (if desired). This has a kit fee of \$48.

December 7, 2025

Laura Baumgartner will lead a wool (not felt) ornament workshop. We expect to have a sample preview for the September newsletter. Enrollment is limited to 12 at this time. There will be kit fee.

February 14, 2026

April 21, 2026


