

COMFORT QUITS

As in the past several years, your generosity has allowed the guild to donate 100 quilts to Homeland Hospice for their annual Christmas Caroling and to their general client population. A number of you have offered to help us distribute quilts to other agencies, and we are trying to

make this a smooth and easy process. With that in mind, we will try to make the guilts available for distribution directly from our meetings, so there is no need for you to pick them up. We usually package the quilts in large plastic bags, five per bag, so they are relatively light and easy to transport. Some of the places also accept fiddle quilts, so please let Jane Shull know if you need those. As we initiate this new process, we welcome any suggestions to streamline things and get the quilts out to where they do the most good, in the hands and laps of those in need.


