Accidents: What Art Taught Me About Creating
Community

About David:

"I am no artist. In 2017, my Gramma Bruce died, and as I was clearing out her things, I found an ancient sketchpad with some abandoned drawings I'd done in my early teens. My grandma hadn't kept much, but she'd kept these, and I thought, "If I'm ever going to learn to draw, I'd better get on it." In the fall, I signed up for Drawing 101-3 at Place des Artes, a local community centre. In the winter of 2018, I took a watercolour workshop (essentially an infomercial to sell expensive art supplies), and I fell in love."



Rev. David was ordained to the ministry of word, sacrament and pastoral care in 2003. He served as the first openly gay minister of Knox United Brandon from 2007 to 2012 and was active in Brandon Pride and the arts community. Knox became an Affirming Ministry during David's tenure, and he worked with the LGBTQ+ Collective at Brandon University to organize Brandon's first observance of the Transgender Day of Remembrance in 2008. David currently serves Trinity United Church in Port Coquitlam, BC on the unceded territory of the Coast Salish Peoples, the Kwikwetlem First Nations.
