

KNOX GREEN TEAM JOB POSTING

Sustainable City Animator : **Starting June 6, 22**

This position is a full time position, with an expectation of 40 hours/week but willing to be flexible. Work location is Knox United Church, 451 18th St. although working from other locations is possible. The animator is responsible to the Green Team of Knox United Church, with primary contacts Madelyn Robinson and Debby Dandy.

The Animator should be prepared to work independently and establish their own work plan on a weekly basis. Compensation for cell phone costs will be provided.

1. Conduct research into actions taken in cities identified as Sustainable Cities in Canada and other countries. This information will be compiled in a way that can be readily shared and edited.
2. Organize meetings with representatives of City of Brandon, and other relevant community members to collect information related to current climate action in Brandon and western Manitoba. This information will be compiled in a way that can be readily shared & edited.
3. Collect information from local, provincial and national climate organizations to identify actions underway to reduce contributions to GHG's and resource extraction. This information will be compiled in a way that can be readily shared and edited.
4. Collect information from relevant academics at Brandon University, Assiniboine and Red River Colleges, University of Manitoba, & University of Winnipeg regarding climate remediation. This information will be compiled in a way that can be readily shared and edited.
5. Complete a review of relevant journals, books, and videos which can be used in community actions.
6. Document actions which could be implemented in Brandon and surrounding municipalities to reduce environmental impacts.
7. Prepare a visual representation of recommended steps that could be taken in Brandon to reduce emissions and become a more sustainable community.
8. Prepare a presentation of results of research and information collected, and present to City, Municipal, community and Green Team representatives.
9. Ensure that a video of the presentation is saved and available for future information sharing.

A message for all members of Knox community of faith:

On behalf of the Knox community of faith, our council made difficult decisions during Covid. We followed provincial guidelines in closing the church, allowing only vaccinated people to attend upon our reopening in October of 2021. Our goal was to mitigate risk and allow more people to attend.

The council recognizes that in our concern for those vulnerable to Covid, those who chose not to be vaccinated or who were unable to be vaccinated were excluded from joining the Knox community for a period of time. We regret that this exclusion seemed necessary to ensure the safety of those who were at risk. A livestream of our gathering was available to anyone who was not in church, although we recognize this option still left some feeling isolated during a difficult time. The council understands that some felt unwelcome to attend in person.

We rejoice in the return to 'normal' and welcome everyone who has felt excluded from attending services at Knox. If you, or someone you know, has been staying away for fear of covid or in response to our policies, we look forward to seeing you back again. We welcome all who come!



Reminder: While the church was closed due to Covid we had an alarm system installed. It is connected to an Alarm Monitoring System. If you or someone else have a key to the church that has not been used recently or often and have not received an alarm code. We need you to contact the office before using the key after

Start putting things away now for the fall rummage sale!!

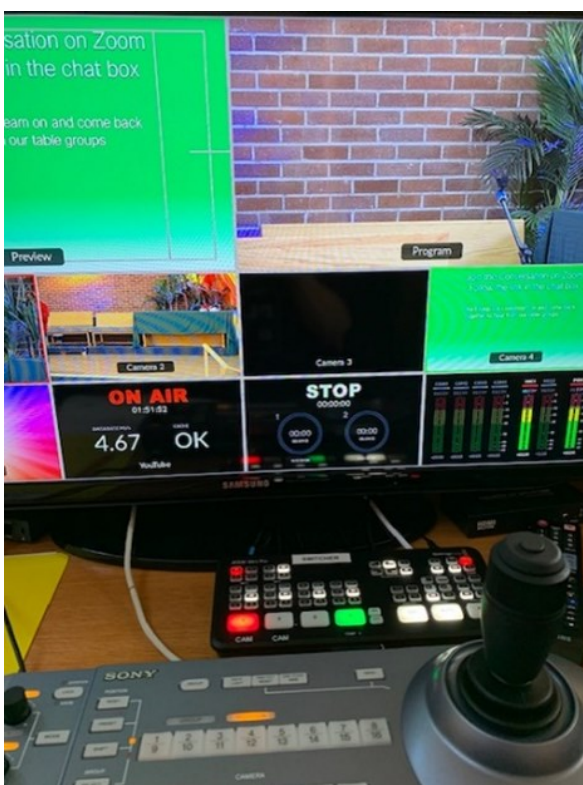




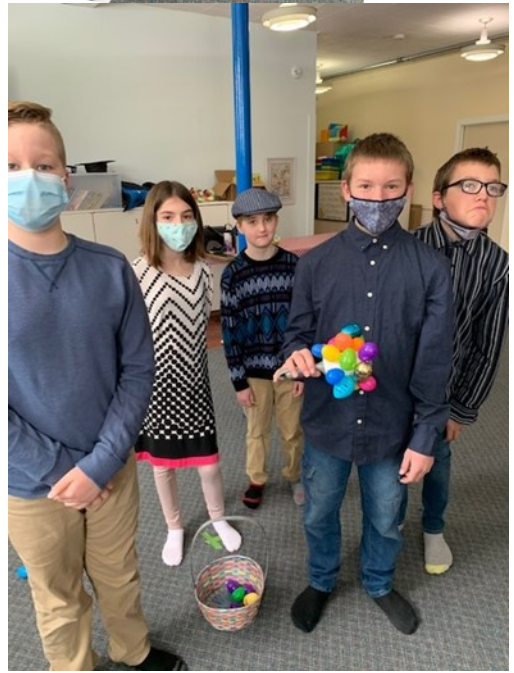
