Brown Bag Lunch: 7th St Access Center

Center provided an information session on the services they provide. Most individuals who present at Knox or other churches for help are now directed to the Center for supports, whereas in the past Knox often directly assisted. An annual contribution is made to the Benevolent Fund at the Center to assist with those needs which cannot be covered elsewhere.

A wide range of services are provided at 7th St:

- free access to phone,
 voice mail, computer,
 photocopying
- laundry and shower
- emergency food on weekends
- assistance with income tax returns
- -assistance to navigate the community services systems to obtain needed supports
- -Counseling, case management, parenting support
- access to medical treatment by Dr and Nurse Practitioner

- -addictions counseling , access to take home Naloxone
- -pharmacist and dietician consultations



Amnesty International Canada used the day to encourage Canadians to renew their commitment to supporting Indigenous water defenders. Amnesty says the 2014 Mount Polley mine disaster in British Columbia, the ongoing harmful impacts of industrial pollution at Grassy Narrows, and the construction of the Site C dam in B.C.'s Peace Valley all represent instances of environmental racism and threats to fresh water.

As agreed by those present, a second session will be held on April 11 from 12:00 noon to 1:30 pm, again a brown bag lunch. Please feel free to attend even if you were not at the first one.

Spring is here. Brandon PRIDE is just around the corner! Knox will once again plan to march in the PRIDE Parade and have a table at PRIDE in the Park. Our Knox PRIDE worship service is scheduled for June 9, at the beginning of of PRIDE week. Watch for further details.

Knox Visioning Committee - "Let's Talk Knox"

Knox held a Visioning session with Leslee Harrison of EDGE in November. Leslee led a gathering of just over 50 people through a guided discussion process. Following that session, there have been four sessions held to discuss and discern the future of Knox going into the next 3 to 5 years. Sessions have been held at varying times (after church, at the Annual Congregational Meeting and in the evening) to try to allow for the most representative sample of Knox people to attend. After each session, the committee gathered all the feedback to the questions posed, summarized the feedback and sent it out to everyone on the Knox email list.

One last session is planned for April 7 after church. After this last session the Committee will compile a report of all the responses and present it to both Council and at the Annual Congregational Meeting on May 5. Council may have some suggestions as to how we proceed with future planning. Come to the Annual Congregational Meeting to learn more and share your ideas!

Living the Questions — A Spiritual Journey

A Small Group Study Honouring Creation

Many of us in the United Church believe an open and inclusive form of Christianity has something good to offer the human race. At the same time, many have a sense that "salvaging" Christianity is a hopeless task given outdated doctrine, abuses by the institutional church, and society's disdain for Religion but attraction to Spirituality.

For decades Knox has sought to offer a safe environment where participants have permission to ask the questions they've always wanted to ask but have been afraid to voice. Living the Questions provides a context where group members can pursue their questions, learn from conversations in the Emerging Church, and seek to inform their understanding as part of a life-long spiritual journey. Through exposure to provocative theological and spiritual insights and the engagement of small group conversation, participants in Living the Questions will experience how profoundly important the journey itself is. Open to youth and adults.

KAIROS Canada faithful action for justice

Urgent Action: Ramp up the pressure for the Ombudsperson

We still need your help! We need you to take action again to call on the government to live up to its promise to create an independent Ombudperson with the power to compel documents and to investigate. The Ombudsman is intended to hold Canadian mining companies and their subsidiaries, as well as oil and gas and garment sectors with Canadian ties, accountable for human rights violations at their overseas operations.

In January, on the one-year anniversary of the Government of Canada's announcement of the creation of the Canadian Ombudsperson for Responsible Enterprise (CORE), KAIROS put out an urgent action to call on the Government to act on this promise. Thank you for all your calls, letters, posts, and tweets. More are needed because we are now convinced that the government is trying to delay the creation of an effective ombudsperson with the power to compel documents and testimony until it is too late to do so during the current mandate.

But it's not over yet...as long as we don't stay silent!


