In 2019 flood events we seen the following diseases: Rain Scald, Pneumonia, Three-Day Sickness, injuries/soreness, Hoof Abscesses & Leptospirosis, Tetanus and many more. We have information handouts; we can email to you. But we are also uploading them to our social media and websites for our clients not on social media.

Some of what I believe graziers may need right now, supplies graziers may require include antibiotics, pain relief, 4 in1 (Injection under the skin supplement) & Ketol (for malnourished animals - bogged/down animals), bandaging/wound supplies and repellents, vaccines (tetanus/leptospirosis/clostridials), vitamins and personal protective equipment.

Logistics: In Longreach this currently looks like organising prescriptions/supplies through Veterinarians (as above) and then the grazier can contact Longreach Regional Council on 4658 4111 and request transportation - air freight would be arranged with groceries/any other urgent supplies being delivered.
