I understand that the State of Montana provides that certain divisions of land, which would otherwise constitute subdivisions, are exempt from local subdivision review and approval, unless the transactions are an attempt to evade the Montana Subdivision and Platting Act.

I recognize that I may be subject to penalty if my actions are deemed to be an effort to evade subdivision review, as set forth in the Montana Code Annotated:

• 76-3-301(3). If transfers not in accordance with this chapter [i.e., Chapter 3, Local Regulation of Subdivisions] are made, the City attorney shall commence action to enjoin further sales or transfers and compel compliance with all provisions of this chapter. The cost of such action shall be imposed against the party not prevailing.

- 76-3-105 Violations. Any person who violates any provision of this chapter [i.e., Chapter 3, Local Regulation of Subdivisions] or any local regulations adopted pursuant thereto shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and punishable by a fine of not less than \$100 or more than \$500 or by imprisonment in a City jail for not more than 3 months or by both fine and imprisonment. Each sale, lease, or transfer of each separate parcel of land in violation of any provision of this chapter or any local regulation adopted pursuant thereto shall be deemed a separate and distinct offense.
- 45-7-201. Perjury.
 - (1) A person commits the offense of perjury if in any official proceeding he knowingly makes a false statement under oath or equivalent affirmation or swears or affirms the truth of a statement previously made, when the statement is material.
 - (2) A person convicted of perjury shall be punished by imprisonment in the state prison for any term not to exceed 10 years or shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$50,000, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
 - (3) Falsification is material, regardless of the admissibility of the statement under rules of evidence, if it could have affected the course or outcome of the proceeding. It is no defense that the declarant mistakenly believed the falsification to be immaterial. Whether a falsification is material in a given factual situation is a question of law.
 - (4) It is not a defense to prosecution under this section that the oath or affirmation was administered or taken in an irregular manner or that the declarant was not competent to make the statement. A document purporting to be made upon oath or affirmation at any time when the offender presents it as being so verified shall be deemed to have been duly sworn or affirmed.
 - (5) No person shall be guilty of an offense under this section if he retracted the falsification in the course of the proceeding in which it was made before it became manifest that the falsification was or would be exposed and before the falsification substantially affected the proceeding.
 - (6) Where the defendant made inconsistent statements under oath or equivalent affirmation, both having been made within the period of the statute of limitations, the prosecution may proceed by setting forth the inconsistent statements in a single count alleging in the alternative that one or the other was false and not believed by the defendant. In such case it shall not be necessary for the prosecution to prove which statement was false but only that one or the other was false and not believed by the defendant to be true.
 - (7) No person shall be convicted of an offense under this section where proof of falsity rests solely upon the testimony of a single person other than the defendant.
- 45-7-202. False swearing.
 - (1) A person commits the offense of false swearing if he knowingly makes a false statement under oath or equivalent affirmation or swears or affirms the truth of such a statement previously made when he does not believe the statement to be true and:
 - (a) the falsification occurs in an official proceeding;
 - (b) the falsification is purposely made to mislead a public servant in performing his official function; or
 - (c) the statement is one which is required by law to be sworn or affirmed before a notary or other person authorized to administer oaths.
 - (2) Subsections (4) through (7) of 45-7-201 apply to this section.
 - (3) A person convicted of false swearing shall be fined not to exceed \$500 or be imprisoned in the

VARIANCE REQUEST 408 MAIDEN LANE

I am writing regarding Tim Hoyt's request to place a fifth wheel trailer on his private property on Maiden Lane. This situation arises because he intends to provide housing for his elderly sister, who is in poor health, has difficulty with stairs, is on a limited income, and currently lacks other housing options. I acknowledge Mr. Hoyt's intention to assist his sister and wish to express support for his request under these circumstances.

The initial challenge in this situation is the setback requirements outlined in the city code. The 5th wheel exceeds the required setback by 18 inches. The city council may consider allowing a variance for this, as the adjacent property owner has indicated no objections.

Some may argue this could set a precedent in Thompson Falls, but basing decisions on what "might" happen is not persuasive. The immediate concern is providing housing for an elderly woman, rather than potential future impacts on the town's appearance. Each future case can be considered individually.

From the city code sec 2-1-5

"where there are practical difficulties or unnecessary hardships......the board of adjustment in a specific case shall have the power to vary or modify any of the regulations or provisions relating to the setback"

I recommend permitting Mr. Hoyt's plan to assist his sister with housing as a medical health variance.

Alternatively, it may be appropriate to consider applying for a Conditional Use Permit. Although I noted that "Conditional Use Permits" for temporary workers are generally limited to 30 days, Zoning Ordinance 10-1-20 does not specify a 30-day restriction. The ordinance only requires defined start and end dates and allows for renewal. Therefore, one possible approach would be to grant a Conditional Use Permit for three years, subject to renewal.

I am not comfortable with denying Myr. Hoyt and his sister their request. I feel I must support what I feel is the right thing to do. My conscience won't allow me to base a decision on 18 inches or what "might" happen in the future.

Mr and Mrs Clark's leak issue began in October 2024, with complications, and was corrected as of their last water bill – July 2025. To determine the correct credit, we determined the gallons used in the same time period from October 2023 to July 2024 and compared the difference.

Job Description Janitor

Nature of Work:

The Janitor reports directly to the City Mayor. The Janitor is responsible for the general upkeep and overall appearance of the buildings' work and public areas as may be assigned.

Job Essentials:

- Able to follow oral and written instructions utilizing the English language well enough to perform the essential duties of the job.
- Possess math skills for adding, subtracting, multiplying, and dividing sufficiently to perform job duties.
- Possess the dexterity to use a telephone and janitorial equipment.
- Able to frequently lift and/or move up to 25 pounds and occasionally lift and/or move up to 50 pounds.
- Must be able to hear with or without amplification devices.
- Demonstrate a self-motivated attitude and ability to comprehend the importance and confidential nature of all information.

Job Duties:

- Responsible for and prioritizes in a timely manner, the maintenance and cleaning responsibilities of all areas of the property including the common areas, offices, and restrooms.
- Sweep, remove debris, clean spills, scrub, mop, vacuum as required throughout the common areas of the building (stairwells, court room, hallways, etc.) and office spaces.
- Regularly check the trash receptacles, emptying as needed, in all areas of the site.
- Service, clean, and supply restrooms in offices and common areas.
- Dust furniture, walls and equipment in the building, including common rooms/areas.
- Replace light bulbs throughout the building.
- Keep janitorial supplies in stock and cleaning equipment in working order.

Other Duties:

Other duties as assigned by the City Mayor. Please note, this job description is not designed to cover or contain a comprehensive listing of activities, duties, or responsibilities that are required of the employee for this job. Duties, responsibilities, and activities may change at any time with or without notice.

Education and Experience:

- High school diploma or GED.
- Two years' experience working with various pieces of janitorial equipment, including vacuum cleaner, mops, etc..
- Well-developed interpersonal skills, timing management and crisis management skills; organization and prioritizing abilities; attention to detail and accuracy; sound judgment and reasoning ability; excellent written and oral communication skills; disposition to perform other duties as assigned; and ability to meet deadlines.

Work Conditions:

This job operates in a building containing multiple floors. This role routinely uses standard janitorial equipment and tools; occasionally uses office equipment. This is a smoke-free environment.

Physical Demands:

While performing the duties of this job, the employee is regularly required to stand; walk; use hands to hold, handle or feel; reach with hands and arms; and talk or hear.
