There was a Main Gravity Sewer Line backup that was caused by a variety of garbage (such as flushable wipes, shop towels, etc.) being put into the sewer system. A letter was sent reminding customers about prohibited materials.

The solar powered Speed Feed Back signs are not getting enough cumulative sun this time of year to fully charge the batteries. They are working intermittently when there is enough sun to power the Feed Back sign and/or charge batteries. Public Works has checked with

the supplier, and this is the answer. Options such as providing electrical connections to the signs would be expensive and difficult.

The MTSEP (Montana Coal Endowment Program) Grant had letters of conditions and contracts that were to be signed by this last September 30, 2024. Due to COVID and then the auditing company we were contracting with stopped doing Federal audits and we did not have our audit for FY23 completed. This created a complication for the MTSEP deadline. We were able to engage a new auditor who needed some time to prepare our audit for FY 23 -the completed one is in your packet. This same auditor is currently auditing for our FY24. This coming Friday, Chelsea and I will be in Helena to present information to the Legislature about retaining the MTSEP grant for our Water Project. This grant was awarded at \$750,000.

I was advised there was a rumor on local social media about fluoride in the Thompson Falls public water system. The answer is NO.

SUBORDINATION AND ENCROACHMENT AGREEMENT

This Subordination and Encroachment Agreement (Agreement) is made and entered into this 10th day of December, 2024 by and between **NorthWestern Corporation d/b/a NorthWestern Energy**, a Delaware corporation, 11 East Park Street Butte, Montana 59701-1711 ("NorthWestern"), as successor in interest to the Montana Power Company, and **The City of Thompson Falls**, 108 Fulton Street, Thompson Falls, MT 59873 ("the City"), each referred to as "Party" or collectively as "Parties" and provides as follows:

Recitals

- A. NorthWestern is the owner of the beneficial interests arising pursuant to an easement for facilities in Sanders County, Montana, more particularly described as an easement from O.J. Murray & Gertrude Murray in favor of the Montana Power Company, recorded in Volume 59 on Page 186 of the records of Sanders County, State of Montana. (the Easement).
- B. Among the real property burdened by the Easement, is a certain parcel of real property, located in Sanders County, Montana, and which is more particularly described as:

TOWNSHIP 21 NORTH, RANGE 29 WEST, P.M.M., SANDERS COUNTY, MT.,

Section 09: A parcel of land located in the NW1/4NW1/4 of Section 09, Township 21 North, Range 29 West, P.M.M., Sanders County, Montana, further described as Certificate of Survey No. 3598 **and** Parcel B on Certificate of Survey No. 3404, on file in the office of the Clerk & Recorder of Sanders County, Montana.

- C. NorthWestern operates overhead electrical facilities within the Easement.
- D. The City has described an underground sewer line, which will encroach within the Easement and is located under NorthWestern's overhead facilities (the Encroachment).

- E. The City has sought NorthWestern's consent to the Encroachment.
- F. NorthWestern is willing to allow the Encroachment subject to and in accordance with the terms and conditions as set out in this Agreement.

Agreement

Now therefore, for good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. Priority of Use Rights and Subordination. NorthWestern's right to utilize the Easement for the purposes described therein and as set out in this Agreement shall be, at all times, paramount and superior to the City's use of the areas encumbered by the Easement. The City acknowledges that his/her rights within the areas encumbered by the Easement are and shall remain subordinate to NorthWestern's rights arising under the Easement.
- 2. <u>Use Rights</u>. NorthWestern shall have the right to utilize the Easement in any manner necessary to allow for the continued operation, maintenance, repair, replacement, upgrade, or removal of its power poles, power lines, guy wires, and other associated equipment (NorthWestern's Facilities) without restriction.
- 3. The City's Representations. The City represents and warrants as follows:
 - a. The City is lawfully seized and possessed of the sewer line and has the good, lawful and unrestricted right to enter into this Agreement.
 - b. The location of the Easement, to the extent it affects the City's property, and the location of the Encroachment are depicted on the attached Exhibit "A", attached hereto and made a part hereof.
 - c. In constructing the Encroachment, the City shall obtain, prior to construction, all necessary easements, permits, consents, certifications and permissions required by all applicable property owners, federal state or local statutes, rules, regulations and ordinances.
- 4. <u>Consent to Encroachment and Conditions</u>. Based upon the representations and agreements set out herein, and subject to the terms of this Agreement, NorthWestern hereby gives its consent so the City may construct, use, maintain, repair, replace and remove the Encroachment. The City shall comply with the conditions as follows:

- a. The City shall be responsible for the costs and expenses of all construction, use, maintenance, repair, replacement and removal of the Encroachment.
- b. The City shall construct, use, maintain, repair, replace and remove the Encroachment in such a manner that it does not in any way interfere with NorthWestern's Facilities. The City shall not construct the Encroachment within twenty-five feet (25') of any Northwestern owned utility pole. The Encroachment shall maintain a minimum 36" depth below grade within the Easement.
- c. The City shall not move, expand, relocate or alter the Encroachment (including without limitation any increases in the height of the Encroachment) without first obtaining the written consent of NorthWestern.
- d. The City's construction, use, maintenance, repair, replacement and removal of the Encroachment shall, at all times, fully comply with all applicable federal, state or local statutes, rules, regulations and ordinances.
- 5. Non-interference. At no time shall the construction, use, maintenance, repair replacement and removal of the Encroachment or the City's activities interfere with NorthWestern's Facilities or its rights arising under the Easement or this Agreement. Further, the Encroachment must not be altered to a condition which violates National Electric Safety Code (latest edition) clearances, other regulatory requirements or NorthWestern's policies. Any conflict with the encroachment rights permitted herein and NorthWestern's obligations under the National Electric Safety Code (latest edition), other regulatory requirements or NorthWestern's policies shall be resolved in favor of such obligations of NorthWestern.
- 6. <u>Reimbursement to NorthWestern</u>. If NorthWestern is required to perform maintenance, construction or repair work on NorthWestern's Facilities resulting from the actions of the City, its contractors, subcontractors, agents or representatives, or if NorthWestern is required to remove any part of the Encroachment, as result of a default hereunder, then the City shall, within twenty (20) days of demand, reimburse NorthWestern for the costs and expenses of such maintenance, construction, repair or removal work.
- 7. <u>Release</u>. NorthWestern shall not be liable for damages to the Encroachment or the City's personal property or for personal injury or death to the City, arising from NorthWestern's operation, construction, maintenance, repair, replacement, upgrade or removal of its facilities. In this regard the City, it successors and assigns, hereby releases and covenants not to sue NorthWestern, its directors,

officers, employees, contractors, and agents, for any property damages or bodily injury or death, arising out of, resulting from, or occurring in connection with the construction, use, maintenance, repair replacement and removal of the Encroachment or the City's activities, or the alleged negligence or negligence of the City, its employees, contractors, or agents. This release shall survive the termination of this Agreement.

- 8. <u>Indemnification</u>. The City, its successors and assigns, shall indemnify and hold harmless NorthWestern, its directors, officers, employees, contractors, and agents from and against all actions, suits, claims, demands, losses, damages, judgments, fines, penalties, costs, expenses, and fees (including reasonable attorney fees and court costs incurred enforcing this indemnity obligation or defending a third-party claim through any final appeal) or liability of any character whatsoever, brought or asserted for injuries to or death of any person or persons, damages to property, or a violation of any federal state or local statute, rule, regulation or ordinance (including but not limited to, environmental, safety or health statute, rule, regulation, or ordinance), arising out of, resulting from, or occurring in connection with the construction, use, maintenance, repair replacement and removal of the Encroachment, or any breach of the terms of this Agreement by the City, or the City's activities, or the alleged negligence or negligence of the City shall survive the termination of this Agreement.
- 9. <u>Term.</u> So long as the Encroachment remains, as permitted herein, this Agreement shall continue in effect. Should the Encroachment be eliminated or removed, the City, its successors and assigns, shall cooperate with NorthWestern in preparing, executing and recording a revocation of this Agreement.
- 10. No Warranty. NorthWestern makes no representation or warranties whatsoever regarding the Encroachment, or the City's activities within the Easement. Further NorthWestern does not guarantee or warrant the suitability of the Easement area for the City's proposed use and occupancy, or that the proposed use or occupancy is permitted or in compliance with any law, regulation, or ordinance. The City is responsible for obtaining any and all necessary easements and/or permits and to ensure compliance with all applicable laws and regulations in connection with the construction, use, maintenance, repair, replacement and removal of the Encroachment.
- 11. <u>Safety</u>. The Parties understand that work in and around high voltage electrical lines and natural gas pipelines is inherently dangerous. All activities of the City, its employees, agents, contractors and representatives must be in compliance with federal, state and local laws and regulations, including but not limited to regulations of the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) and conformance with the National Electric Safety Code (latest edition). In any

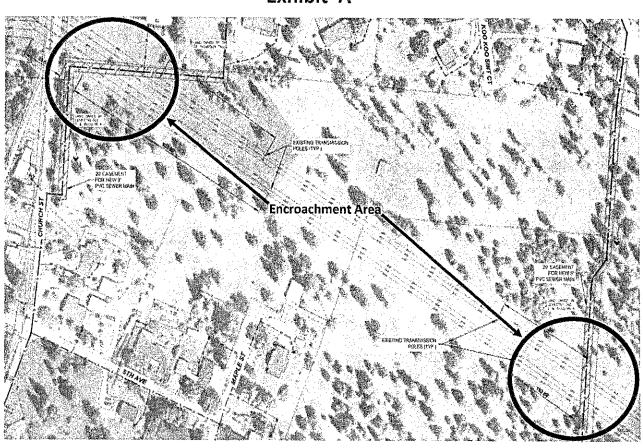
situation where any law or regulation is in conflict with any other law or regulation, the most stringent requirements shall be followed. The City shall at all times be in control of the safety of the work site at which it conducts activities under this Agreement. NorthWestern requires the City to certify that its employees, contractors, or agents have the knowledge necessary to meet NorthWestern's and OSHA requirements. Neither the requirements that the City follow said practices and applicable law, rules, and regulations, nor NorthWestern's right to inspect and/or suspend the work, shall relieve the City of the sole responsibility to maintain safe and efficient working conditions. The City acknowledges that it has read and understood the publication, "Overhead Power line Safety for Contractors".

- 12. EMF, Static Charge, Line Fall and Radio/TV Interference. The City understands that electric power lines generate electromagnetic fields, which have been alleged to cause a health hazard, though scientific research has not shown this to be the case. Further, the City acknowledges the potential for "static charge" build-up/discharge from metal objects, for line fall, and for interference with radio and television reception and transmission. The release and indemnity provisions contained herein, include but are not limited to health issues, claims or allegations arising from exposure to EMF, "static charge" build-up/discharge, line fall and radio/television interference.
- 13. <u>Default</u>. Should the City, its successors or assigns, default in the performance of its obligations set forth herein and such default continues unremedied for a period of thirty (30) days after written notice, generally specifying the nature of the default, provided by NorthWestern to the City, unless the nature of the default presents imminent concerns for the integrity of NorthWestern's Facilities or a safety threat, to be determined in NorthWestern's sole discretion, in which event the notice shall be a period of three (3) days, NorthWestern, at its option, without further notice, may cancel and terminate all of the City's rights hereunder and may pursue any and all other remedies that may be available to it under the laws of Montana resulting from such default, including requiring the City to remove the Encroachment and return the Easement area to the condition it was before the Encroachment was constructed. It is specifically agreed that NorthWestern shall have the remedy of specific performance available in the event of the City's default, but such remedy shall not limit the availability of other remedies available to it under this Agreement or law.
- 14. <u>Fees and Costs</u>. The City, its successors and assigns, shall pay all fees and costs, including reasonable court costs and attorneys' fees through final appeal, incurred by NorthWestern, in relation to its enforcement of this Agreement.
- 15. <u>Notice</u>. All notices to be given under this Agreement may be personally served upon the Party to whom it is directed or mailed to such Party in certified, United

- States mail, with postage prepaid, at its address set forth above and such notice shall be deemed effective three days after deposit in any United States post office.
- 16. <u>Time and Parties</u>. Time of performance is of the essence of this Agreement. All the terms and provisions shall extend to and be binding upon the parties, their respective, heirs, personal representatives, successors and assigns.
- 17. Entire Agreement. This Agreement supersedes all prior discussions and agreements between the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and contains the sole and entire agreement between the Parties.
- 18. <u>Waiver</u>. Any term and condition of this Agreement may be waived at any time by the Party who is entitled to the benefit thereof, but no such waiver shall be effective unless set forth in a written instrument executed by on behalf of the Party waiving such term or condition. No waiver of any part of any term or condition, in any one or more instances, may be deemed to be or construed as a waiver of the same or any other term and condition in this agreement on any further occasion.
- 19. <u>Amendment</u>. This Agreement may be amended, supplemented or modified only by written instrument executed by or on behalf of each Party.
- 20. <u>Headings</u>. The headings used in this Agreement have been inserted for convenience of reference only and do not define or limit the provisions hereof.
- 21. <u>Invalid Provisions</u>. If any provision of this Agreement is held to be illegal, invalid or unenforceable under any present or future law, and if the rights or obligations of any Party under this Agreement will not be materially or adversely affected thereby, such provision will be fully severable, this Agreement will be construed and enforced as if such illegal, invalid or unenforceable provision had never comprised a part hereof, and the remaining provisions of this Agreement will remain in effect and will not be effected by the illegal, invalid or unenforceable provisions or by its severance.
- 22. <u>Certification</u>. The individuals signing on behalf of the Parties, each hereby represent that they are duly authorized and empowered to execute this Agreement on behalf of the Party for whom each signs, and that once signed that this will be binding on the Parties hereto.

Wastewater System Improvements Ph. 1 & 2:

- Ph. 1 & 2 Construction with RAZZ has been deemed final, as of the end November 2024.
 - o Pay Application 33 was approved and paid by the City in January 2025
 - City & Great West (GWE) received pay application 32 that also requests release of retainage from RAZZ to close out the majority of project items open with RAZZ
 - Working with City's Attorney on closing out any remaining final items per contract.
- Great West continues to finalize the Operation and Maintenance Manual + Project As-builts in February.
- Great West continues completing on-going grant administration and coordinating grant close-out items as well as any remaining draw/project status update and paperwork needed. Grant admin activities will continue until all project activities are closed out.
- Sludge Project (reminder this is work being completed by a separate contractor, TCI).
 - TCI has dewatered sludge as much as they plan to before removal
 - TCI has taken sludge samples required for land application and disposal plan/report.
 - TCI has not received samples of proposed sludge land application site.
 - GWE is waiting to receive land application site permitting & final sludge plan for submittal and DEQ concurrence from TCI.

Wastewater System Improvements Ph 3 & 4:

- Great West has received comments on the DEQ submittal plans. No major comments that alter main project design components. Final responses and all letters requested by DEQ are planned to be submitted by Feb. 7, 2025.
 - The Mayor & City Staff have worked to finalize residential easements & all documentation is in place as requested by funding agencies
 - GWE is working with the City and City attorney to confirm finalized record easements.
 - GWE has submitted Deviations to BNSF permit application and supplied existing utility easement documentation as requested by BNSF.
 - o Geotechnical Report has been incorporated into the final construction documents.
 - Electrical engineering plans are finalized & have been coordinated with the City's Integrator
 - GWE has coordinated with City's integrator for SCADA work needed for the three new lift stations to tie into the existing WW system.
 - Other permits: MDT has been received
- Once DEQ approval & BNSF permit is received GWE will see out funding agency approval to go out for bidding.
- Construction calendar days are approximately 500 days; therefore, Contractor will have two
 construction seasons to complete the work & a winter shutdown is included

Water System Improvements

- Field study plan is finalized for Well/aquifer capacity. GWE plans to solicit bids from local contractors to test existing wells & monitor during testing in mid February. Bid solicitation meets ARPA funding requirements as long as Contractor work comes in less than \$80K.
 - Once City's go ahead is recieved for solicitation of bids for this work, GWE is planning to have bids and bid recommendation by March council meeting.
- Water System replacement Final Plans are at 80%, GWE is looking to submit tank and waterline improvements to DEQ at the end of February. GWE will review most current plan set with City's public works for review and input & will look to incorporate before DEQ review.
 - Geotechnical field work was completed at Jefferson Tank site for new tank SK geotechnical & draft report has been received, GWE is working with SK on final Tank Geotech recommendations to finalize tank design & plans.
 - Forest Service has been involved in team communication & will review final plans concurrently with DEQ review.
 - Currently planning to include new well design and plans for final project barring field study results with City's approval.

Church Street Emergency Waterline Replacement Construction:

- Construction is completed as of December 2024
 - Work was completed on schedule and budget currently, excepting spring weather cleanup and paving.
- Contractor, City & GWE need to hold final walk through. GWE will work to coordinate with all parties.

Stormwater PER

- Stormwater PER work has begun, reviewing existing area information and records
 - GWE will be requesting information and holding work sessions with the City's public work staff to inform the report prior to council meetings to review findings.
 - o Great West Admin. Staff has completed startup conditions.
 - Generally timeline is still will be over the next approximate 6 months, will work with
 City staff to finalize detailed schedule and pin down any target dates.

Growth Policy Update

- Great West and City submitted a CDBG planning grant for Thompson Falls on Nov. 1, 2024
 & received notice of award in Jan. 2025. GWE will assist the City with startup conditions.
 - Planning grant requires a 25% match, Growth Policy cost is approximately \$35,000.
 The grant application for CDBG requested \$25,500 in grant funds.

Infrastructure Website:

Great West has updated the www.<u>Cityofthompsonfallsinfrastructure.com</u> which in the past
was used for the original WW PER and has morphed into an infrastructure hub for the City's
current projects with Great West as the on-call engineer.

 - o GWE assisted the City during the Month of November to publicly bid paving work within scope of SLIPA grant.
 - Bids were opened 12.5.24 two bids received (TCI & Interstate)
 - TCI was awarded the contract before the end of the year (2024)
 - GWE issued award recommendation for City issued the Issue a Notice of award executed the construction agreement
 - Work is scheduled to be completed during construction season of 2025.
- GWE has drafted Task Order 8 to the City's on-call contract for Engineering and Grant
 Administration services for the above noted work & as outlined in the SLIPA project budget
 for the Feb. 2025 council meeting.
