

Entry Details

DEDUCT \$50 FROM THE PUBLISHED SCOTCH DOUBLES ENTRY FEES IF AT LEAST ONE OF THE SCOTCH DOUBLES PARTNERS IS STAYING AT THE WESTGATE [MARKED “YES” IN THE COLUMN] DURING COMPETITION

- **DAIFEE:** If you are staying at the Westgate Las Vegas during the ACS Nationals, you are required to record your hotel reservation confirmation # on your entry form, and submit:
Open/Standard Scotch Doubles: “Early Bird” \$113 / “Regular” \$135 / “Late” (after 3/22/21) \$160 (amounts incl. \$25/team GREENS FEE)
Advanced 8-Ball Scotch Doubles: “Early Bird” \$145 / “Regular” \$175 / “Late” (after 3/22/21) \$200 (amounts incl. \$25/team GREENS FEE)
- IF YOU ARE NOT STAYING AT THE WESTGATE LAS VEGAS DURING YOUR COMPETITION DATES AT THE 2021 ACS NATIONALS, YOU ARE REQUIRED TO SUBMIT THE APPROPRIATE SCOTCH DOUBLES ENTRY FEES UNDER THE “NO” COLUMN ON THE ENTRY FORM !!!
- For “ACS Nationals” discounted \$65 WEEKDAY/ \$85 WEEKEND WESTGATE HOTEL RATE: GO TO <https://book.passkey.com/go/SACAIR>. The discounted rate at the Westgate Las Vegas is available through April 23, 2021,...AND...YOU MUST RESERVE USING THE ACS-EVENT-SPECIFIC WEBSITE IN ORDER TO GAIN THE DISCOUNTED \$15 DAILY RESORT FEE! [We recommend all attendees make their reservations prior to January 30, 2021!] **“EARLY-BIRD” DISCOUNTED ENTRY FEE: If you postmark any entry fees by January 30, 2021, pay the 20% discounted entry fee stated on the front of this entry form.** Entry fees on the entry form in the “YES” column reflect 20% discount **AFTER** the \$50 deduction for staying at the Westgate and deducting greens fees. “Early-Bird” discount % if you are NOT staying at the Westgate is slightly less.
- \$10 is deducted from each Scotch Doubles entry fee towards a Registration Fee.

PAYMENT INFORMATION: Enclose entry fee with form. All fees must be in U.S. dollars. Postmark your entry by Monday, March 22, 2021, to qualify for the Standard Entry Fee. Between March 23 and April 5, 2021, pay the Late Entry Fee. Late entries must be paid in US funds by cashier’s check, traveler’s check, money order, credit card, PayPal or online. Credit card and PayPal payments will be assessed an additional 5% (7% CAN) merchant finance fee. No personal, business or league checks will be accepted for entries postmarked after March 22, 2021. No entries postmarked after April 5, 2021 will be accepted. No exceptions! Take advantage of the **“EARLY BIRD” ENTRY FEE for 2021 if postmarked or online by January 30, 2021 !**

ELIGIBILITY: NEW! Teams in Scotch Doubles divisions may be composed of one man and one woman from ANY ACS/CCS/MPA-sanctioned league (need NOT be from the same league) who have both played a minimum of four (4) full matches over a minimum four (4) weeks during one sanctioned session since June 1, 2020. **IN 2021: Partners may be from separate ACS/CCS/MPA leagues!**

RATINGS:

MASTER/ADVANCED PLAYER: Any player listed on any state or national Advanced, Intermediate or Masters lists, incl. VNEA and BCAPL...or “Known Ability” with skills commensurate with players on these lists. Professional players are not eligible. (see entry form)

OPEN PLAYER: Any player who does not meet “Advanced Player” guidelines and who averages an “8” or “9” in a league that uses the 10-point scoring system or the equivalent if using other scoring systems - an average or above-average player in most leagues.

STANDARD PLAYER: Any player who does not meet “Open or Advanced Player” guidelines and who averages a “7” or below in a league that uses the 10-point scoring system or the equivalent if using other scoring systems – a below-average player in most leagues.

FORMAT

All Scotch Doubles divisions are 8-ball, double-elimination and races to:

Open/Standard 8-Ball Scotch Doubles: Race to 4 in the winner’s bracket/ Race to 3 in the loser’s bracket
Advanced 8-Ball Scotch Doubles: Race to 5 in the winner’s bracket/ Race to 5 in the loser’s bracket

CHECK – IN: Singles and Scotch Doubles entries are not required to check-in onsite, but should stop by the ACS registration desk to collect their tournament “goodie bag”. For safety reasons, face masks may be requested. ACS-logoed masks will be on sale at registration.

DRESS CODE – SCOTCH DOUBLES:

Same requirement as Singles competition (see below). Matching shirts worn by Scotch Doubles teams are preferred, but not mandatory. *Best Dressed* Scotch Doubles Team partners each receive a plaque !

SINGLES EVENTS

DRESS CODE: Sleeved shirts of polo/golf-style or button-down style with a conventional fold-over collar are required. T-shirts and sweatshirts are not allowed. Players may wear conventional-style hats. Hats/Visors/Caps are allowed with the bill facing forward. No knit hats, stocking caps, or any other headgear. Ear buds, cell phones, etc. are not permitted. Men must wear long pants or neat, clean, untorn jeans. Warm-up suits and jogging suits are not allowed. Women may wear dress pants, Capri-style pants, or neat, clean, untorn jeans, culottes, and skirts or sleeved dresses (of conservative length). Men and women must wear clean, neat, close-toed shoes at all times. Should a player require a footwear exception for medical reasons, the player must provide a letter on official letterhead from the player’s health care provider before the tournament (and keep a copy of the letter available for review by a referee at all times; if requested). **FURTHER DRESS CODE DETAILS AT www.americancuesports.org.**

SCOTCH DOUBLES RULES

- Teams with no Advanced/Master players may enter the Open Scotch Doubles division. Standard Scotch Doubles Team if BOTH players are Standard.
- Teams with a minimum of one Advanced/Master player must compete in the Advanced Scotch Doubles division.
- Players on a team alternate each shot. The alternating team breaks; either team member may break.
- Teams may alternate shooting rotation after each game. Failure to stay in rotation once the game has started will result in a FOUL. The original rotation must be restored on their next turn. Note: It is permissible to inquire as to whose shot it is at anytime without fear of a coaching foul. Any further discussion when the team is deemed to be “at the table” will result in a FOUL.
- NO COACHING: When a team is not “at the table”, they may quietly discuss anything they please...or not. No time outs or coaching allowed. Any assistance (verbal or non-verbal) by a team during their turn at the table is a FOUL.
- When the table is turned over to the incoming team, one of the partners must immediately approach the table.
- Any of the four players involved with the matches may call a FOUL.
