View the city from the terraces of the Cathedral of Santa Maria, open seasonally.

Transport back in time to the 14th century at the circular Bellver Castle.

Hike the UNESCO-listed Serra de Tramuntana, Mallorca's most famous mountain.

Paddle across the nearly 4,000-foot-long underground lake of the Drach Caves.

Catch some rays—or waves—at Mallorca's largest beach, Playa de Muro.

Revisit ancient history at the Son Fornes archaeological site, a Talayotic settlement.

Stroll the colorful, cobbled streets of the medieval town of Valldemossa.

## 5-DAY CURATED ITINERARY

- Day 1** Give yourself a relaxing overview of the seaside resort town of Palma de Mallorca with a ride on a hop-on/hop-off double-decker bus. Learn about the history of the sights around you, disembarking as you like to explore what you choose.
- Day 2** Prepare for a full day of sightseeing, beginning with the guided *Palma City Xperience* tour. Visit Palma's most important landmarks, including the Cathedral; its magnificent interior was once curated by famous Catalan architect Antoni Gaudí. Continue on to the Old Town for a walking tour, stopping at the Gothic Bellver Castle before having free time to discover on your own.
- Day 3** Depart Palma de Mallorca for the medieval town of Valldemossa, where you'll walk a former Carthusian monastery—which the great composer Chopin once called home—and charming streets lined with shops, restaurants, and cafés. Don't forget to sample local treat *coca de potata*, a sweet potato roll topped with powdered sugar.
- Day 4** Today, explore Mallorca's closest neighboring island, Menorca, on a private sailboat tour. Get some of the best views of its pristine beaches, then explore its crystal-clear waters by kayak, paddleboard, or through snorkeling. Or, opt for a bite as satisfying as the views with a Mahon cheese-making class at a Menorcan dairy farm.
- Day 5** Pay the Old Town one final visit for a last souvenir and sights sweep before bidding *despedida* to the Balearic Islands.
