### Latest News from Secretary Brett Davis, PDDGER

In accordance with Grand Lodge Statute Section 14.160: A member delinquent and owing at least five month's dues to the Lodge shall be dropped from the rolls any time during the month of March each year without a vote of the Lodge. The effective date for dropping the Member shall be not later than March 31, provided the delinquent dues are not

paid. A list of the Members who will be dropped can be found on page 4 of this newsletter.

Once a Member is dropped from the rolls he becomes an unaffiliated Elk and in accordance with GLS 14.190 is not permitted to visit any Lodge nor avail himself of the privileges of the bar or restaurant of any Lodge in any way or manner.

### Nominations - February 11, 2021

#### GLS 3.080

\_Any Member in good standing, regardless of residence, and except for those ineligible under Secs. 8.180, ,9.010, 9.011, 9.040 and 9.300, may be nominated for any elective Lodge office by any Member in good standing. Nominees are not required to openly accept a nomination, and need not be present.

If a Member has been nominated for more that one office, he must declare that he accepts one nomination and withdraw from other nominations and if he does not do so, he must accept only the first nomination. Nominations may be made on election night only if no nomination for that office has been made or if all candidates for that office have declined or withdrawn. Nomination speeches may be limited with the consent of the Lodge.

### Election of Officers - February 25, 2021

#### GLS 3.090

Only Members who are not delinquent in their dues may vote in an election.

Absentee or proxy voting in not permitted.

The vote is by secret ballot and a Member should not disclose his vote. The nominee receiving the majority of votes cast shall be declared elected. If case there shall be but one nominee for any office, the Lodge may direct any officer to cast the vote of the Lodge for the nominee. If the Lodge approves, speeches for candidates may be made at the Lodge election.

Officers retain their office until their successors are duly installed.

We also provide the Elks National Veterans Service Commission with funding to support its volunteers working in veterans hospitals and medical centers.

Funding for VAVS Volunteers: \$27,780.00

Grand Total: \$846,900.00

That's a ratio of **2.184** for every dollar the Foundation received from your state last year. And that doesn't even include the money Lodges in your state will get back through our <u>Community Investments Program</u>.

For the 2019-20 fiscal year, for example, we awarded a total of \$545,760.00 to 85 Florida Lodges.
