Ranging from \$2,000 to \$3,000, these grants are the ENF's way of thanking Lodges that reached the National President's giving goal in the previous year. In 2020-2021, the goal was \$4.80. Our Lodge achieved that goal with \$4.98 per member and will be eligible for a Grant.

Last year, the CIP (Community Investment Program) added more flexibility for Lodges to meet pandemic-related needs, and the same flexibility will be in place for this next round of Gratitude Grants. For some Lodges, the increased flexibility led to new opportunities for membership and community support.

The 202-2022 fiscal year kicked off on Due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, Lodges are encouraged to think about donating to food pantries or other local organizations that are better equipped to directly serve the population in need affected by the pandemic.
