

One *Stitch* at a Time

Materials List

All Students

1 ½ to 2” sewing pins

Pin cushion



(The ultimate pin caddy from Dritz is my favorite style for those traveling to and from class.)

Online students and students who want to do work at home. (In person students my use my material in class.)

Sewing scissors – for fabric and tissue patterns **ONLY** – 8 or 9” sewing scissors, Fiskers, Westcott and Ginghers are common brands. Fiskers and Westcott typically have plastic handles and run about \$15. One should expect about 5 years of use and to retire them to the junk drawer. Ginghers are all metal, run about \$30. These can be sharpened and will last a lifetime.



Marking tools – this can be tailor’s chalk and water-soluble marking pens. The pencils don’t usually work unless you buy the ones meant for quilting which cost more. Clover pencils do work. **DO NOT** get the purple air soluble markers.

Seam Ripper – I prefer the ones with the narrowest pointy bit.



Measuring Tape – 60” fabric

Chopstick

100% polyester, dual duty, all-purpose thread

Safety Pins – assorted sizes

Highlighter



Optional – seam gauge, French curve or other assorted clear rulers. You should have an iron and ironing board available to you at home.
