



Do you have a loved one in a nursing home or Intermediate Care Facility for Individuals with Intellectual Disabilities that needs assistance transitioning back into the community?

The Oklahoma Living Choice Program may be what you are looking for. The Oklahoma Living Choice Program assists qualified Oklahomans to transition out of a nursing home/ICF-IID back into the community into their own residence.

Oklahoma Living Choice Program qualifications include:

- Be at least 19 years of age with a disability, or 65 and over.
- Qualify for SoonerCare (Oklahoma's Medicaid program) for at least one day prior to transition.
- Has lived in an institutional setting (nursing home/intermediate care facility) for at least 90 consecutive days prior to transition.
- Voluntarily want to transition back into the community.
- Must be willing to play an active role in your plan of care.

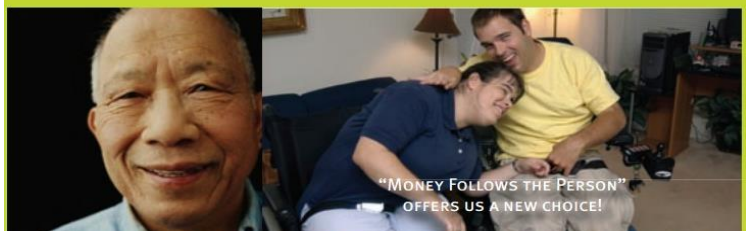
