

Cat Adoption Questionnaire

The animals available for adoption at the Humane Society shelter are what we term “random source” animals, meaning that we accept unwanted animals from anyone and anywhere. We want you to understand that any time you adopt an animal from an animal welfare organization; you do take a certain risk. ***We do our best to screen the health of each animal as it is admitted and during the time it is housed at our shelter. However, there is always a chance that the animal is incubating a disease at the time of admission without showing any clinical signs of the disease.*** This simply means that the animal appears healthy and if it had been exposed to disease before admission, the vaccinations it received on admission would be ineffective in combating the disease.

In order to be considered as an adopter today you must, be 18 years or older, have identification showing your present address, have the knowledge and consent of all adults living in your household; be able and willing to spend the time and money necessary to provide training, medical treatment, and proper care for the pet; have the cash to pay an adoption fee (if you plan to pay by check, we require a valid TEXAS Drivers’ License) have the knowledge and consent of your landlord; understand that the Humane Society has the right to approve or deny your adoption application; and understand that this application will be retained in our files.
