



Our neighboring city of Tracy is home to the Grand Theater Center for the Arts. Join us for an interactive discussion with William Wilson, Cultural Arts Supervisor. This is an opportunity to get an insider view of one of the few facilities of its kind in the US. His topics will include the relationships between artists and their communities.

The classical Grand Theater opened on August 11, 1923. It has been historically renovated to once again offer live performances of all kinds as well as multi-media presentations and cinema. This municipal interdisciplinary arts center offers professional and community-based fine arts programming



through arts education, exhibitions, performances and rentals of all kinds, in a single complex, and is one of only a small network of similar facilities in America.

Mr. Wilson will share insights into the operation and programming of the 37,000-square-foot interdisciplinary arts center that houses two theaters (including the historic Grand), three art galleries, and nine specialized studio classrooms. There will be a Q&A period. https://atthegrand.org.
