DAC President Sawsan Wolski expressed heart-felt thanks to Summer Ellis (moving to Florida) for her contributions. While building DAC's membership, Sawsan is also talking to the City of Dublin about art initiatives in collaboration with the Cultural Arts Council.

PAL President Beth Okurowski informed about a possible PAL Online Store, and invited volunteers to form an exploratory team. She also announced the possibility of an exciting partnership with the Firehouse Arts Center!

Jennifer Huber shared an overview of PAL's Pals 2021.

Lian Quan Zhen is a sought-after watercolor and Chinese painting artist and teacher in the United Sates and abroad. He is also one of the most popular authors of North Light Art Books. Lian's art credentials include the University of California at Berkeley where he taught watercolor and outdoor sketching for eight years.

Lian will teach basic techniques such as composition and color, using his unique methods including: *Color Pouring and Blending* and his *Paint Around Method*. Joe Milelli: Spoon Wind Chime: I have been making different types of wind chimes lately, mostly of glass and metal for the chimes. A fellow artist mentioned that silver plated utensils can be fashioned into wind chimes with nice tones. The utensils are flattened, drilled and assembled, note the fork hanger. A fused glass piece is the "clapper". It actually works quite well. A fun piece, the concept used by many others.

Garden Butterfly: The piece is designed to be installed in a garden, mounted in a metal support stand. The piece itself is all fused glass, with one layer of clear iridized glass fused to a layer of clear glass. The butterfly was made separately and tack fused to the clear base with colored frit to accent the butterfly. The tack fuse provides relief and texture to the piece. The butterfly design is a favorite style of mine, which I have incorporated into platters, and other fused glass art pieces.





Maria Grazia Romeo:

A year of introspection - "On the Wings of Memory"

Memories are playing a major role in our everyday life and for an artist they are the guiding light to our creativity. I found refuge from the political and pandemic cacophony of the past year by traveling back to my childhood.

I had a dream so vivid when I was 2 or 3 years old that I thought it was a real event for many years afterward. It was during the bombardments in Northern Italy when at night curfew was the rule.



I am the first of six children and when my younger siblings came down with measles I was shipped to my paternal grandparents' house. At that time they lived in a large and beautiful three-story farmhouse. For the first time I was alone with three elderly people (grandfather, grandmother and great grandmother) and had to create a safe place for myself in sharing their living environment

During the Summer months my family used to escape the heat of the city by renting a house from farmers in the mountains. Every day, close to sunset, I was in charge to fetch fresh milk from the owners of the farm. While the cows were milked by the man of the house, the mother was in the kitchen preparing dinner. She kindly used to share a slice of her delicious potato cake with me.





Looking back in time has created a safe place for my mind. I hope it will provide one also for the viewers of my work.
