#### The Holiness of the Season . . .

As we enter December, our church finds itself deep in the journey of our Kingdom Come series. Each week we have listened for God's promise of a world renewed, a world marked not by fear or division but by justice, humility, and hope. These themes are not abstract ideas. They are invitations to let our lives, our congregation, and our community be shaped by the coming reign of God.

This season reminds us that God does not wait for ideal conditions to bring light. Christ enters a world of empire, uncertainty, and longing. He comes quietly, yet powerfully, beginning a kingdom that grows not through force but through faith, courage, compassion, and everyday acts of love. Advent calls us to prepare room not only in our sanctuaries but in our habits. relationships, and priorities. It invites us to expect God to work in ways that surprise us, stretch us, and ultimately bless us.

As Christmas Eve approaches, I want to encourage you to be present, both spiritually and physically. Our services are moments when the truth of the season becomes visible: candles lifted against the darkness, scripture proclaimed, the familiar carols echoing with new meaning. And more than anything, these services are opportunities for us to welcome guests who may be taking their first steps back into church, or into faith altogether.

Your invitation could make all the difference. A neighbor. A coworker. A friend whose year has been heavy. Someone who needs a place to rest, breathe, and hear again that God has drawn near. Advent and Christmas offer a unique openness in people's hearts; let us meet that openness with hospitality, warmth, and joy.

My prayer is that this December will not simply be busy, but holy. That in the midst of gatherings, gift-giving, and decorating, we will remember why we celebrate at all: because the Word became flesh and dwelled among us, full of grace and truth. Because the kingdom we long for has already begun in Jesus Christ. Because light still shines, and the darkness has not overcome it. Let's walk through this month with expectation. Let's worship with gratitude. And let's step into Christmas ready to receive again the astonishing good news that God has come to us, and that his kingdom is breaking in even now.

I look forward to seeing you in worship this Advent and on Christmas Eve. May this season fill your heart with hope and renew our shared calling to live as people of the coming King.

## THEOLOGY MINUTE

WITH PASTOR DYLAN

The second "Article of Religion" focuses on Jesus Christ, the eternal Word of God who "was made very man." As United Methodists, we believe that the Son is of one being with the Father, truly God from all eternity. In the fullness of time, this same eternal Word took on our human nature, born of the Virgin Mary.

In Jesus, two full and perfect natures – divine and human – are united in one person, never to be divided. He is not partly God and partly human, but fully both at once. In this one Lord Jesus Christ, God comes near to us, speaks our language, shares our weakness, and bears our sin.

Through his suffering, death, and resurrection, Christ reconciles us to the Father and offers salvation "for the sins of the whole world." Our hope, our forgiveness, and our future all rest in him.


