We need help with our social committee. Events don't plan themselves and we want our to be top notch.


We need help with our Honor Guard. The more people we have the less likely we are to burn people out of serving.

BOBBY A. ROGERS

Bobby came to life in the Shooting Creek Community. As a native of Clay County, he was

born before Clay County celebrated its 75th Birthday of existence. The **Shooting Creek** Community received its name as a result of an annual shooting festival held by the early pioneers in the area. These early settlers would meet in a

meadow near where Eagle Fork Creek and Penland Creek ioined to form what is known today as Shooting Creek. The pioneers using their muzzle loading rifles in a shooting competition for prizes such as: beef, deer, bear, wild turkey, whiskey, etc. Eventually the name stuck and the community was called "Shooting Creek". Bobby received the opportunity from Uncle Sam to service his country. So, in 1954, he was off to boot camp in Lackland Air Force Base in lovely San Antonio, Texas. Construction on Lackland Air Force Base began on 15 June 1941, and it was

originally part of Kelly Field. Today, Lackland is best known for its role in being the sole location for the U.S. Air Force

> enlisted Basic Military Training (BMT) for the active duty Regular Air Force, Air Force Reserve and Air National Guard. Upon completion of his basic training, Bobby was shipped not so far away to **Kelly Air Force** Base for

technical training.

This technical training at Kelly unveiled a whole new world and prepared him to become a cryptologist. Progressing rapidly in training, soon his skills were honed to a razor-sharp edge in cryptology. After completing training, Bobby set sail on a lovely cruise for about twelve days, on a troop ship to Europe and eventually arrived at his duty station in Landsburg, Germany. Bobby would pass this crypto information on to the Russian traffic analyst and linguist for further analysis. During his three-year tour, Bobby enjoyed, besides work,

attending some of the local German festivals and skiing in the Alps. He was discharged from active duty in 1958.

After his military service Bobby worked for Delta Airlines until he attended college. After graduating from college Bobby worked for a Chevrolet Dealership as the Fleet and Commercial Sales Manager.

After Bobby retired, he and his wife, Betty returned home to Clay County and live on the old family farm.

Bobby is certainly from a military family. Three of his brothers served in the military, two in the Navy and one in the Army. His oldest brother served in the Navy before WWII ended and is nearly 95 years old. He made a career in the Navy, serving in WWII, Korean War and Vietnam

War. He sailed the seven seas on a Landing Ship Tank (Tank landing Ship) or better known as an LST. All four of Bobby's sisters married men who served in the military. His youngest sister's husband rose through the ranks and became a Captain in the Air Force and served in the Vietnam War in Combat Control and later with a missel silo squadron before retirement.

OPERATION GREEN LIGHT

Operation Green Light is an initiative to shine a light on the plight of veterans in counties across the country who are having a hard time connecting with benefits after serving their country.

As of 2019, 11.7 million veterans are over the age of 65, which is about 61 percent of all Veterans. Veterans make up roughly 11 percent of adults experiencing homelessness. Some 70 percent of Veterans experiencing homelessness also experience substance abuse, and 50 percent five with mental illness like post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD).

These numbers indicate that it is extremely difficult to transition from military to civilian life and there is no way to ascertain when veterans have moved or are currently living in a

particular county. This makes it very difficult to connect them to their earned benefits.

With Operation Green Light launching nationwide, counties will literally shine green lights from their county buildings from November 7-13 (Veterans Day is November 11) to inspire Veterans to reach out to their Veteran Service Officer for assistance with their health care eligibility, disability compensation, tax exemptions, educational benefits, etc.

At this time, when we especially honor our Veterans, let us all make a deeper commitment to recognize the sacrifices made by those who have served our country. If you recognize a Veteran that needs assistance let him/her know that Clay County supports him/her with a service to assist. OUR VETERANS SERVICE OFFICE.
