

Care and Medicare... by Deloris Witcher "My people perish for lack of knowledge." Hosea 4:6a

Medicare is health insurance for individuals aged 65 and older, as well as some with disabilities. There are critical deadlines for applying for Medicare to avoid being responsible for your healthcare bills. Sign up during the 7-month enrollment period

that starts 3 months before your 65th birthday and ends 3 months after. Medicare Part A covers hospital and rehabilitation services. If you or your spouse are still working and have employer-provided health insurance, you can delay enrolling in Medicare Part B, which covers doctors, visits, tests, and outpatient services, and Part D, which covers medication. Educate yourself before signing up for Medicare Advantage Plans, which usually include Parts A, B, and D, versus traditional Medicare. Advantage Plans can seem attractive, but they do not give you control of your healthcare. Finally, explore supplement or Medigap plans that cover costs Medicare doesn't pay for, such as Part A hospital deductibles and Part B's 20 percent coinsurance.


