






#### **Chase Beasley**


#### IN THE SPOTLIGHT

#### Wait, What about Weights?... by Deloris Witcher

"Physical exercise profits little." 1 Timothy 4:8a

Some of us, if truth be told, are overdue for a little "profit" in the physical exercise realm. A little exercise, especially with weights, can be profitable. Weight training, especially with light weights, offers numerous health benefits, including improved muscle strength, balance, coordination, stronger bones, joint flexibility, injury prevention, and better sleep quality. Weightlifting also offers significant benefits for people with Type 2 diabetes by improving insulin sensitivity, increasing glucose uptake into muscles, and reducing overall fat mass. It can lead to better blood sugar control, improved metabolism, and a decreased risk of heart disease. Beginners should start slowly with proper technique, aiming for 8-15 repetitions of 1-3 sets, and

gradually increase intensity. The American College of Sports Medicine recommends two 15–30-minute strength training sessions per week, combined with 75 minutes of vigorous aerobic exercise, with medical consultation advised before starting.

Don't wait to lift weights. Register for 10 professional group personal training sessions starting Monday, October 27, 2025, with the QR code. Sessions are \$10 each and space is limited.
