BLACK HISTORY MONTH HIGHLIGHTS

Antioch commemorated Black History Month during the last two Sundays of February worship services. On February 19th, we honored "Past & Present Role Models". The service began with the congregation and choir joining together to sing the Negro National Anthem "Lift Every Voice". Paying tribute to four prominent figures in the black community, Antioch recognized their achievements, contributions, and sacrifices through song and dance. These figures were poet and activist Amanda Gorman, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of the United States Justice Ketanji Brown Jackson, American abolitionist and activist Harriet Tubman, and politician and civil rights activist John Lewis.



In addition, Antioch's own Jim and Jean Jones were recognized and applauded for their strong activism and participation in marches during the civil rights era. Jim and Jean were both arrested for 4 days in Baltimore, MD while students at Morgan State University. They could not go across the street to the Northwood Shopping Center to shop or sit down and eat so they started demonstrations. Today, Morgan State University owns the Northwood Shopping Center which now houses academic classrooms, administrative offices, and commercial establishments. 2015, Jim and Jean were awarded an Honorary Doctor of Laws Degree from Morgan State University.

The February 26th service celebrated the importance of historically black colleges and universities (HBCUs) and the Divine Nine Fraternities and Sororities. Members were encouraged to represent their HBCUs and organizations by wearing their respective paraphernalia or school colors. A short video presentation narrated by professor and historian Henry Louis Gates, Jr. gave a quick yet detailed explanation of the history of HBCUs and why their legacy is so imperative in the black community. As service concluded, many members gathered and reunited with other former alumni and students to share stories and reminisce of their HCBU experiences.

Women's Ministry Offers a Joyful Place to Learn, Grow, and Share in Sisterly Fellowship

Antioch's Women's Ministry is one of the Church's most vibrant and welcoming ministries. Established in 1990 under the direction of Rev. John Q. Gibbs, the ministry is currently led by Sister Sandra Streeter, who applauded the previous leaders—Sister Renee Chambers, Deaconess Margo Adams, Dr. Janice McLaughlin-George, and Sister Rochella Marable, all of whom “set a standard of excellence in serving the Lord and the Sisters who faithfully attend Women's Ministry events.”



Sister Streeter said the ministry supports Antioch's mission of "'Loving God and Loving Others' and is committed to providing guidance and instruction in biblical principles that promote spiritual growth and intimacy with our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ."

While the ministry is grounded in Proverbs 27:17—"As iron sharpens iron, so one person (sister) sharpens another"—a foundational Scripture that aligns with an annual theme is selected each year. The theme for 2023 is Women of the Bible—God's Purpose, Plan, and Promises; the foundational Scripture is Ephesians 2:10—"We are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand so that we would walk in them."

This year a special emphasis has been placed on identifying ways to increase participation by youth and young adults. Dawn Thompson co-facilitates a small group discussion for younger participants. We are also extending a personal invitation to all Sisters joining us to bring your daughters, mothers, granddaughters, and friends—all Sisters are welcome!

"Any Sister who desires to be in fellowship with others with the goal of growing in the wisdom and knowledge of God's word and life applications to support you in your daily walk, should join Women's Ministry," says Sister Streeter. "Our Bible Study and Fellowships are integral in the spiritual growth and development of our Sisters. The benefits are godly wisdom, biblical instruction, equipping Sisters for good works, and encouraging them in their faith walk."

The ministry has identified areas of service for Sisters in need, including opportunities to provide donations for domestic violence shelters and food for local food banks. Spring Luncheon at the Country Club of Fairfax will be held on April 22, 2023. The theme is "A Time of Renewal."

Sister Streeter encourages women to take the Spiritual Gifts Inventory to help identify their God-given gifts/talents/abilities and provide direction to the areas where they can serve and give back to the Body of Christ.

"Antioch Women's Ministry brings women together from all walks of life and from across the United States. When we are in each other's presence, we are just Sisters," she said. "The love, joy, and excitement overflows from the moment an event begins to the moment we say goodbye. It is refreshing to be part of and witness how the Sisters come together to worship the Lord through studying, praying, singing, and beautiful acts of kindness towards each other. The Sisters are eager to support others who are in need, help carry their burdens, and rejoice in their joys and victories. I am also deeply grateful for the Women's Ministry Team members who are prayer warriors and willing servants. Women's Ministry is truly a God-inspired Sisterhood!"

Antioch Women's Ministry meets on the first Saturday of the month from 10am-12pm, February through June; and September through December for Bible Study or Fellowships.
