In 2003, she was elected district attorney of San Francisco. She was elected Attorney General of California in 2010 and re-elected in 2014. Harris served as the junior United States senator from California from 2017 to 2021. Harris is the second African American woman and the first South Asian American to serve in the United States Senate. She is the first Black woman to serve as Vice President of the United States of America.

Please pray for Vice President Harris as she walks where no other woman has journeyed. We may not agree with all of the political decisions from the Biden/Harris administration, but as the church we must pray for them and wish them success.
