Often, when African American Southern Baptists picture missionaries, they think about the pictures of missionaries that they've seen and



few look like them.Many of our churches don't associate International Mission Board missionaries with being African American, so they are pleasantly surprised when they meet us. Church Connections has allowed us to show African Americans they have a place and role to play in the missionary task.

When our churches see missionaries who look like them, they feel more represented. And what we tell them is, "There is a place for you. God is calling you; you can be a part of reaching the world, and He wants to use you and your church." African American Southern Baptists aren't the only people who've been surprised to meet us. When we moved into our house in Tanzania, our neighbors wanted to know where the missionary was, and why Muslims moved in next door. "I have lived here for 40 years, and no one like you has ever lived in this mission house," a neighbor said. Tanzanian Christians celebrated our arrival.

"Where are our other brothers and sisters? You're the first ones that we've seen that looked like us," Tanzanian Christians have asked us.

We still hear that, 20 years after we arrived in the country. African American missionaries have tremendous opportunities to make deep connections on the mission field.

Through Church Connections, we have the opportunity to help churches to think about what those opportunities might look like working with us in Dar es Salaam, the capital city, or working with the IMB in other countries. 

Prejudice and Forgiveness By: <u>Arthur Jackson</u> (published in Our Daily Bread digital edition) I now realize how true it is that God does not show favoritism.

Acts 10:34

After hearing a message about correcting injustice, a church member approached the pastor weeping, asking for forgiveness and confessing that he hadn't voted in favor of calling the black minister to be pastor of their church because of his own prejudice. "I really need you to forgive me. I don't want the junk of prejudice and racism spilling over into my kids' lives. I didn't vote for you, and I was wrong." His tears and confession were met with the tears and forgiveness of the minister. A week later, the entire church rejoiced upon hearing the man's testimony of how God had worked in his heart.

Even Peter, a disciple of Jesus and a chief leader in the early church, had to be corrected because of his ill-conceived notions about non-Jewish people. Eating and drinking with gentiles (who were considered unclean), was a violation of social and religious protocol. Peter said, "You are well aware that it is against our law for a Jew to associate with or visit a Gentile" (<u>Acts 10:28</u>). It took nothing less than the supernatural activity of God (vv. 9-23) to convince him that he "should not call anyone impure or unclean (v. 28).

Through the preaching of Scripture, the conviction of the Spirit, and life experiences, God continues to work in human hearts to correct our misguided perspectives about others. He helps us to see that "God does not show favoritism" (v. 34).
