Patrick had a lifelong appreciation for soccer and snow skiing, passions he developed while living in Germany. A loyal fan of Bayern München, one of the highlights of his life was attending a live match in Munich. In Arkansas, he developed a love for fishing, catfish, and Old School music—a gift he shared with family through countless playlists and musical memories. He was especially fond of his Rottweilers, Atticus and Baer, and always delighted in a home-cooked German Schnitzel dinner made by his mother.

As a stepfather, Patrick embraced the role of mentor and encourager to Destiny, whom he loved deeply. He was especially proud when she took up soccer and snow skiing, two of his favorite pastimes.

Though we mourn Patrick's passing, we rejoice in the promise of a heavenly reunion. Heaven has gained an angel. While our hearts are heavy, we rest in the blessed assurance of God's eternal plan.


















































## Poem Of Life
