





Who is the Holy Spirit? Part 2 Rev. Jim Harden Learn more about the Holy Spirit and His role in your life.



Single But In a Relationship with God by Gabrielle Santiago



The ICONIC 6888th Central Postal Directory Battalion

In 1944, First Lady Eleanor Roosevelt along with Mary McLeod Bethune (National Council of Negro Women), advocated for the admittance of African American Women into the Women's Army Corps (WAC). They worked to get support for a role for Black women in Europe during World War II. Recruitment of African American women was limited to 10% of the WAC population, which was equivalent to the proportion of African Americans in the U.S. population.

In November of 1944, the War Department approved sending African American women to serve in Europe. The 6888th Central Postal Directory Battalion was established. Making it the first and only predominately all Black WAC Unit sent overseas. The mission of the unit, which consisted of approximately 855 women, was to sort about 17 million pieces of mail that had been stored in warehouses and not delivered for up to three years. The troops serving in Europe during WWII and the families here at home were not receiving mail. This lack of communication had a major negative impact on the morale of the troops and their families.

The 6888th Battalion was deployed to Birmingham England in February 1945. Their motto was "No mail-low morale". The Battalion spent time in England, Rouen and Paris, France clearing millions of pieces of mail. The conditions were challenging. They faced racism, sexism, working in buildings without heat in the winter, discrimination by fellow service personnel, and the task of working around-the-clock shifts 7 days a week. They created systems to sort and deliver mail to the troops who were constantly moving and also to their families. The unit processed 65,000 pieces of mail each shift, and they handled mail for 4 million military troops.

The mission was completed in 90 days instead of the six months allotted. This was a task that they were not expected to accomplish. The unit returned to the United States where it was discontinued in March 1946. Upon their return, there was no public recognition for their service.



The House of Representatives introduced H.R. 1012 on February 11th, 2021 to award a Congressional Gold Medal to the members of the Women's Army Corps who were assigned to the 6888th Battalion. This bill became law in March 2022.

The Medal is currently being minted.



On September 16, 2024, the Virginia General Assembly designated the day as the 6888th Central Postal Directory Battalion Day which will be recognized in each succeeding year.

The movie about the 6888th Battalion, currently available on Netflix, was written, directed, and produced by Tyler Perry.

Antioch has a direct connection to the 6888th Battalion: Mother Catherine Dailey is the sister of the late Audrey Romaine Lucas, who was a member of the 6888th Battalion. Ms. Lucas has two nieces who also are members of Antioch, Sister Madeline Arter and Sister Betty Mial.
