The Resurrection of Christ: A Glorious Victory

As we celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, we are reminded of the powerful hope we have through His triumph over death. In the Gospel of Mark, we find a poignant and profound account of the moment that changed the world forever. Mark's Gospel, though brief in details, paints a vivid picture of Christ's victory, showing us the unwavering faith and boldness required to believe in the miraculous.

Mark 16:1-8 records the moment when Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome visit Jesus' tomb, expecting to find His body. To their astonishment, the stone has been rolled away, and an angel tells them that Jesus has risen. The message of hope is clear: Jesus is no longer in the grave! He has risen, just as He said He would. This victory over death affirms our salvation and gives us the promise of eternal life through Him.

In this season of resurrection, let us reflect on the power of Jesus' sacrifice and His victory over sin and death. The resurrection is not just a historical event, but a present reality that gives us hope, peace, and the strength to walk boldly in faith. As we look to Jesus' example, let us remember that we too are called to fulfill our purpose. Just as Jesus fulfilled His purpose at Calvary, we are to remain focused on fulfilling the purpose God has placed in our lives. **God has made us for more.**

The Journey of a Risen King

Holy Week is a celebration of the last moments of Jesus' life and His resurrection. From Palm Sunday to Resurrection Sunday, the last week of Jesus' life takes Christians through a story of humility, suffering, grace, and celebration. So, what is there to celebrate? We celebrate how God's grace sent us a King who was willing to give His own life so that we may have everlasting life. As we celebrate God's grace and Jesus' act of love, let's take a moment to journey with Jesus through this magnificent week.

One Sunday morning, Jesus humbly entered Jerusalem on a donkey. This day is referred to by Christians as Palm Sunday. This day, thousands of followers and disciples waved palms in joyous praise of Jesus, the King of Kings, and they laid palm branches and their cloaks on the road before Him. The people shouted "Hosanna! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord." (John 12:13 NIV) Hosanna means "O save us" in Hebrew.


As the week goes on, Jesus spent much of His time in the temple teaching his followers and preparing the disciples for what was about to happen in a matter of days. Jesus shared many parables and lessons as the chief priest looked on in anger. The priests were angry with Jesus' popularity. They did not believe Jesus was Who He said He was. Although Jesus was about to suffer an unimaginable death, He continued to teach His followers the way.

Maundy Thursday is the day that Jesus celebrated the last Passover (better known to most as the Last Supper) and washed the feet of the disciples. Even as Jesus was about to make the greatest sacrifice, Jesus showed us His humility and loving nature by washing the feet of the disciples. Why would the King perform this great act of love and humility? Because of Who "He" is. As Jesus washed the disciples' feet, He commanded the disciples to "love one another as I have loved you." (John 13:34 NIV)

And then there's Good Friday—the day Jesus laid d<mark>ow</mark>n His life for us on an old rugged wooden cross. They crucified our Lord on trumped-up charges, and yet Jesus forgave them as He stated, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." (Luke 23:34a ESV) Many may wonder why did Jesus do it. Love! It's that simple. He did it out of love for us. He gave His life so that we could live our lives free of sin. But the story doesn't end here.

Early Sunday morning, Jesus woke up, moved the rock aside that enclosed the tomb, and walked out with all power in His hands. Jesus defeated death. And for that reason we may live with Jesus in Heaven forever. Every Christian should celebrate! Resurrection Sunday is recognized and celebrated on Easter Sunday. But in reality, we should celebrate Easter every single day. Jesus made the ultimate sacrifice because of His love for each one of us. On this day and every day, we should do as He commands – Love others as Jesus loves you. Happy Easter!

Growing up in Kinston, NC, I recognized, at an early age, the importance of understanding the details connected to my homework assignments. Things like knowing the word count, the assignment deadline, and the desired format were all important pieces of information. I rarely made assumptions about an assignment as a kid, and at this stage of my life, I run far from the chaos that assumptions have been known to cause. To successfully *complete* the assignment, you must first *understand* its demands.
