The Northern Virginia Section offers scholarships to African-American and African-descent high school seniors who have excelled academically and plan to pursue a college degree during the 2020-2021 school year.

## SCHOLARSHIP REQUIREMENTS:

- Must be an African-American or African-descent high school senior attending a public or private high school in the Northern Virginia area and residing in Arlington, Alexandria, Fairfax County, or Falls Church.
- Students must submit an **official** high school transcript
- Must have a GPA of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale
- Must be planning to apply to an accredited institution of postsecondary education for the 2020-2021 academic year.

# SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION PARTICIPANTS WILL BE SELECTED BASED ON THE FOLLOWING CRITERIA:

- Completed scholarship application, postmarked by Wednesday, January 29, 2020 (Grammatically correct and legible)
- High school senior
- Official high school transcript
- Minimal GPA of 2.5 (on a 4.0 scale)
- Completed essay of 500-525 words, double-spaced, 12 pt. font
- **Photo** Attach a recent professional photograph (acceptable formats-PDF, JPG, TIFF) of student to this application.

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# **Oratorical Competition Speech Guidelines:**

### 1. PURPOSE

- A. To provide an opportunity for individual high school seniors to be recognized for individual accomplishments and speaking abilities.
- B. To provide an opportunity for the (NoVA) Section of NCNW, Inc., to support and help community youth pursue their postsecondary educational goals.

### 2. APPLICABILITY

These rules, unless otherwise noted, shall apply to all speech competitors selected by NoVA Section of NCNW, Inc. to participate in the "Prepared For Change, Motivated By Challenges And Ready For Growth" Fourth Annual Oratorical Competition. These rules may not be supplanted or modified, and no exceptions.

### 3. **ELIGIBILITY-** Competitor must be:

- A. A college-bound high school senior attending an accredited high school, and all paperwork must be in appropriate order.
- B. Eligible at all times of this competition. If at any time it is discovered that a competitor is ineligible to compete, the competitor will be disqualified.
- C. Checked in 60 minutes prior to competition for briefing rules and facility orientation.

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
