Antioch's Millennial Ministry Welcomes All Young Adults

Antioch's Millennial Ministry was established in 2019 when our own Rev. Alan Harris began providing weekly Millennial Monday Check-ins, Zoom lessons, and other outside activities during the height of the pandemic to help Antioch's young adults maintain their spiritual connection to God, the church, and their peers.

Rev. Harris was called to lead Beulah Baptist Institutional Church in Tampa and Brother Chase Beasley, who worked alongside Rev. Harris, picked up the mantel.

The mission of the Millennial Ministry is to serve the body of Christ through actions/events but also to provide a safe space for like-minded young adults to voice their opinion. The ministry welcomes any young adults (ages 22 to 40), whether married or single. "All voices and fellowship will be valued in the ministry," Chase said, noting it can be difficult for this generation of young adults to navigate the many challenges—job responsibilities, financial concerns, social media, dating, pop culture and so on—that can distract them from their walk with Christ. "It's a pivotal time in our lives so it's important for everyone in this age group to have people they can relate to and depend on."
