COMMITMENT

The church is at a very critical point in history. For many years, Christianity had homefield advantage in America. PEW Research Center Study indicates that fifty years ago, about ninety percent of Americans called themselves Christians, today that number is sixty-four percent. According to Christian Scholar, Dr. Jeremy J. Buckner and Senior Pastor, Dr. Ray Fowler, to name a few, we have new gods in the land – gods of knowledge, gods of love and connection, and gods of desire.

Theologian Walter Brueggemann refers to this as "the dethroning of Christian privilege". Consequently, we are called to minister in a world of atheists, agnostics, "nones", and polytheists with fewer servants on the team. Most churches, including Antioch, need more servants. The words of Jesus are very relevant to our world, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few". Simply put, there is a commitment problem.

The COVID-19 pandemic widened the servant gaps in our churches. We have servants who are overly committed while there are many members who have not yet committed to serving in a ministry. I am asking every member to see serving as part of your discipleship and stewardship, because it is. Actually, I want you to do more than see it. I pray that you are or will be committed to doing the following:

- Evangelism making followers of Christ
- Discipleship maturing in faith
- Fellowship meeting the spiritual and social needs of Christ followers
- Outreach/Missions modeling Christlike service
- Generosity financially undergirding the work of ministry and missions

Commitment means to entrust oneself entirely to Jesus the Christ and His commands to His church, irrespective of the circumstances. Are you truly committed? Do you need help to reach this level of commitment? Great news! I need help too. Therefore, I will be preaching the entire month to help us shift gears in our commitment to Christ and His church.

BLACK HISTORY IS AMERICAN HISTORY!



Carter G. Woodson (1875-1950) The Father of Black History Month

Black History is Key in Telling America's Story

Black History Month is an important recognition and celebration worldwide of African American achievement and excellence. Programs are held in schools, government halls, churches and other areas to honor African American history, culture, and accomplishments. But did you know that historian Carter G. Woodson, who conceived the idea of Black History Month, initially mobilized his fraternity brothers from Omega Psi Phi in 1924 to introduce Negro History and Literature Week to recognize Black achievement?

Woodson built on that effort to formalize the annual recognition by using the Association for the Study of Negro Life and History—now the Association for the Study of African American Life and History—to launch Negro History Week in February 1926, according to Britannica. The month of February was selected for the recognition

because it was close to the birthdays of President Abraham Lincoln, who had been responsible for the Emancipation Proclamation, and abolitionist Frederick Douglass.

The association organized the recognition to honor the accomplishments of African Americans to encourage scholars to engage in the intensive study of the Black past. "This area of study had previously been largely neglected or distorted in the hands of historians who accepted and perpetuated a biased picture of Black people's role in and influence on American and world affairs. (Britannica). World's Fair

The importance of the continued study of African American life, history and culture is even more critical today as book bans and legislation increase to erase African Americans' contributions and rewrite history. It's also important to remember that the celebration of our culture is a celebration of American history, not just African American history. - 1. Open the Google Play Google Play store by locating the app on your device..
- 2. Locate the search box and type the name of the app you are looking for.
- 3. Click Search.
- 4. Select the app from the search results.
- 5. Tap INSTALL.
- 6. When installation is complete, tap OPEN to launch the app for the first time.

- 1. Locate and open the App Store on your device.
- 2. Click the Search button located in the lower right corner.
- 3. Tap the Search bar and type the name of the app you wish to download.
- 4. Click Search.

Antioch's Dance Ministry—Glorifying God Through Movement

The Antioch Dance Ministry has always brought a sense of joy to Sunday worship services. Established in 1999, the ABC Dance Ministry was founded by Sister Patricia Jennings after being inspired by songs she heard after returning from a church road trip. She was moved to dance to those songs and was encouraged to birth the ministry. Joining alongside were Sisters Keitha Johnson, Joy Thomas, Sheryl Wyatt, Tanya Easley, and Gizelle Abernathy. Sister Abernathy was instrumental in preparing garments and sewing kits for the dancers.



Currently the Dance Ministry is led by Sister Elaine Chandler. Sister Elaine found herself in awe after seeing a group of dancers praise and worship God through dance. She was encouraged to join the ministry by Reverend Yolanda Waller who suggested she pray about becoming a member and has now been leading the ministry since 2008. She states, "the Dance Ministry is especially important because in obedience and by His Word, we are instructed to praise God in this way. Psalm 149:3 reads, "Let them praise His Name with dancing and make music to Him with timbrel and harp." We are to be The Word and His Music, made visible." The Dance Ministry is dedicated to worshiping the Lord through the art of dance and seeking to glorify God in all aspects of our lives.

The Dance Ministry is unique as it is one of Antioch's ministries that is open to just about all ages. It is open to anyone who has a heart to worship God in movement and no prior dance experience is needed. There are five levels within the Dance Ministry: Wee Worship Dancers (ages 5-6), Joyful Praise Dancers (ages 7-9), New Life Dancers (ages 10-18), Hearts of Worship Dancers (ages 19+), and He Is Our Banner Dancers (flag, streamers, and pageantry dancers for ages 10+). Currently the Dance Ministry has 6 adults, 3 teens, and 1 youth dancer.

If you are a worshiper who enjoys movement and want to experience worship before the Lord from "the top of your head to the bottom of your feet", then you are strongly encouraged to join this ministry.

The Dance Ministry ministers during worship services on the 4th Sundays of the month, during holidays and at special events. The ministry will soon resume their outreach to local nursing homes.
