Thank you! Virginia Gibbs Carter grew up as a 'PK' in Hume, Va. She is the daughter of the late Rev. Dr. Thomas H. Gibbs, Sr. and Edrena Nelson Gibbs. At the age of five, Virginia caught rheumatic fever and the doctor told her parents that she would not live more than two years. However, at the age of nine, she accepted Christ and was baptized at the Providence Baptist Church in Orlean, Virginia. Virginia graduated from William C. Taylor High School in Warrenton, Virginia in 1959. She entered the U.S. Federal Government in September of 1959 working as a Clerk Typist for the US Dept. of Agriculture. After 35 years and 4 months In public service, she retired on January 20, 1995 as a Budget Analyst for the Dept. of Health & Human Services.

Antioch's Founding Pastor, the late Rev. Dr. John Q. Gibbs, asked her to serve as Antioch's Treasurer because he knew her skills as a 'bean counter'. She accepted the call and Virginia Gibbs Carter served faithfully as the first treasurer of the Antioch Baptish Church from January 8, 1989 until June 1996. With a servant's heart, she also hosted Antioch's in-home Sunday School and throughout her membership she serves and participates in Feed the Homeless Ministry, Vacation Bible School, Modern Maturity Ministry, Bible Study, Women's Ministry, and much more! A side note: It was Pastor Gibbs who affectionately nick-named her Vee-ay. Sister Carter is a founding member of Antioch. Thank you for your faithful service.

Nutrition Facts

Don't Judge a Book by its Cover... But What About our Food? by Brenda Moore

The Nutrition Facts Label required by the FDA and USDA on most packaged food informs us of nutrients and other ingredients. The calorie count, amount of fat, saturated fat,

carbohydrates, sugars, proteins, and salt volume must be displayed; vitamin content, serving size, and daily percentage value are now usually included. You should always consult with your health care provider regarding your intake needs. Each day the average adult requires about 2,000 calories, less than 20 grams of saturated fat, 0 grams of trans-fat, 1,500 milligrams of sodium (2/3 teaspoon of salt), 25 - 36 grams of added sugar (6 to 9 teaspoons), and 28 grams of fiber. It is important to notice the first few ingredients on the label's list because they are present in the largest amount. Try to avoid: trans-fat, partially hydrogenated oils, high fructose corn syrup, artificial sweeteners, nitrate/nitrites, ambiguous terminology...and stuff you cannot pronounce!

The Roman's Road to Salvation Leads Antioch's Commitment Counseling Ministry

"When Antioch was started, our founding pastor, Reverend John Gibbs, realized the need for the Commitment Counseling Ministry because we were growing at a very rapid rate", said Brother James Griffin, co-leader of Antioch's Commitment Counseling Ministry with Reverend Bernard Snowden. "Pastor Gibbs did not want people confusing membership with salvation and from that premise, the Commitment Counseling Ministry was formed", said Brother Griffin.




Today, the ministry is more important than ever as Antioch continues rebuilding, sharing the word of God, and ministering to the congregation. With the focus on revitalizing our ministries and membership, more commitment counselors are needed to fulfill our purpose of "Loving God, Loving Others". Our goal is to help those who respond to the Invitation to Discipleship to confirm their desire to become a follower of Christ or to join Antioch based on Christian experience.

The ministry is led by teachings from **The Roman's Road**, with verses that explain God's plan for salvation, why we need salvation, how God provides salvation, how we can receive salvation, and the results of salvation. The Apostle Paul says, "For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes...all have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God...whoever calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."

Anyone who is a born-again Christian and willing to share their testimony on how they came to know Jesus Christ as their personal Lord and Savior can join the ministry. Ministry servants must be active members of Antioch who attend services regularly, are growing in their walk with Christ and enjoy sharing the Gospel one-on-one with individuals to see others come to a saving knowledge of Christ. Prospective commitment counselors must also attend and complete an evangelism class.

"The Commitment Counseling Ministry is vital to the life of the church because it helps to grow the Kingdom and the local church," Reverend Snowden said.
