Antioch FFX, summer has arrived with a bang! It's been hotter than ever in Virginia! Hopefully, the temperatures will drop a tiny bit so that we can embrace the season with a variety of fun activities. Whether you prefer staying local or venturing out for a vacation, there are options for all tastes and budgets.

Consider remaining local while acting as a tourist by enjoying a staycation in Old Town Alexandria. You could have breakfast or lunch at Hen Quarter, dinner at 1799, and dessert at Midnight Treats — all black owned restaurants. While in Old Town, take a nice stroll near the waterfront, picnic on the lawn, and also experience the beauty that is being created in The Torpedo Factory. There is so much to discover in Old Town including one of the many Black History walking tours. Of course, there are plenty of cute shops and places for people watching.

**For Families:** For those looking for a getaway, consider a trip to Williamsburg, VA. During the 18th century, half of Williamsburg's population was Black. Check out the *African American Experience* in Colonial Williamsburg to learn about the daily life and culture of African Virginians. Williamsburg also has an array of theme park rides at Busch Gardens, shopping, and other family-friendly attractions. Drive a few more miles to peruse the campuses of our renowned HBCUs, including Hampton University, Norfolk State University, and Virginia Union University. If you go to Norfolk, you've got to put your feet in the water in Virginia Beach!





For Couples: Reconnect with a romantic evening at the final performance of Jazz in the Garden series on August 9th at the National Gallery of Art Sculpture Garden in DC. Bring a blanket, a picnic basket, and enjoy the smooth tunes under the stars. If you arrive early, visit the National Gallery of Art to learn about the famous Black photographer, Gordon Parks, at the exhibit *Gordon Parks: Camera Portraits from the Corcoran Collection*.

**For Singles:** If you're up for an adventure, consider a solo or friends trip to New York City. With its vibrant arts scene, iconic landmarks, and endless dining options, the city promises an unforgettable experience. Consider *The Wiz* on Broadway, as it has received stunning reviews. If you decide to go, please enjoy a few favorite places, Serendipity, Strawberry Fields in Central Park, and Dallas BBQ in Times Square. A walk across the Brooklyn Bridge to Dumbo would also be a delight and would give you a nice view of the Statue of Liberty.

The **Right Hand of Fellowship** is extended to all new members after completion of Starting Point, Baptism class, and New Member Orientation as appropriate.











### FIRST TIME VOTING?





#### **VOTING AT A GLANCE**

**Step 1** Visit: <a href="https://www.elections.virginia.gov/citizen-portal/">https://www.elections.virginia.gov/citizen-portal/</a> to check your registration status, and voting history, and update your address, if needed.

Step 2 Register to Vote Online, if not registered Requirements: have a valid Virginia DMV driver's license or state ID card, be a citizen of the US, be a resident of Virginia, and be age 18, or if age 17 will be 18 on or before the General Elections on Tuesday, November 5, 2024. Also, an individual must be at least 16 to preregister but can't vote until the above rules are applied. Last, if a voter is currently convicted of a felony (pending restoration rights) or judged mentally incapacitated you may be disqualified from voting. Now there is the Same Day Registration (SDR). Voters can register and vote via a provisional ballot on the same day as the election, pending all other rules, such as being registered in your district.

**Step 3 Find your Polling Place** (enter your first/last name, date of birth, last 4 digits of your Social Security number, and locality, ex: Fairfax County). Next, find your precinct facility name and location, Congressional District, State Senate, and House of Delegates.

**Step 4 Apply to vote Absentee by Mail** (complete a form to be placed on the Absentee Voting list and receive a ballot before election day). The ballot should be returned via mail, postmarked, and received no later than **Friday November 8, 2024**, or cast on election day **Tuesday, November 5, 2024**, at your precinct in the Election Box. You may also surrender at the polling place in exchange for a regular ballot.

Step 5 Vote Early and In Person, from Friday, September 20 to Saturday, November 2, 2024, at the Fairfax County Government Center or a selected Satellite polling location nearby. You will need an acceptable form of ID like a current or expired Virginia driver's license, a U.S. military ID, or a signed ID confirmation statement. If the statement is not signed, you will be provided a provisional ballot and given a copy of instructions on where to call if your vote is counted.

Remember you are voting for the freedom of our country and every vote counts!

The goal was to provide support to Antioch members experiencing



social and emotional duress. HELPS is an acronym that signifies Healing Each other through Listening compassionately Praying and referring to appropriate supports Showing the love of Christ.

HELPS is currently led by Sister Debra Beasley, a retired Director of School Counseling (Administrator), a Crisis Intervention Specialist, Grief Counseling Specialist and Special Education educator. Sister Beasley credits her profession as an inspiration for her involvement in the development of this ministry.
