Antioch Parking Ministry



Over the years, Antioch's congregants have been recipients of invaluable services provided by the ABC Parking Ministry – judicious parking, deliberate traffic flow and safely directing member movement across our campus.

We've noticed that the Antioch Parking Ministry is usually the first to arrive for church programs and activities — often going above and beyond the call of duty. They are a bold and courageous team of five that volunteer to serve as requested or required. They take their jobs very seriously and are more than qualified -- retired military officers, a lawyer, federal law enforcement, and budget analysts.

We reached out to Brother Clarence Taylor, who heads the ministry, for a few comments. Brother Taylor said any church member 18 years old or older is welcomed to join the ministry, our responsibility is "parking cars in an efficient and safe manner to enhance the workshop experience of members." He said the most challenging part of the ministry is assisting members who do not want to follow instructions but that staying calm and insisting—and assisting—them in following directions helps resolve any issues.

His suggestion for members wanting to help improve the parking experience: "Be kind, patient and follow the instructions of the Parking Ministry."

A few observations give rise to the following humble reflections:

- If you love the Lord and just want to serve, then the Parking Ministry needs you.
- If you believe no job is beneath you and every job has worth, then the Parking Ministry needs you.
- If you are levelheaded and can stay calm when you are ignored while trying to keep everyone safe and direct traffic, then the Parking Ministry needs you.
- If you can shake your head in disbelief as others disrespect you, then the Parking Ministry needs you.
- If you can praise God, smile, and respond as Jesus would to rude comments, then the Parking Ministry needs you.
- If you are willing to work and you don't care about recognition or a simple thank you, then the Parking Ministry needs you.

Equilibria is a premiere Duke University publication which seeks to promote innovative interdisciplinary research in economics. The most recent Edition includes an article written by one of Antioch's own, Mr. Cody Taylor, titled Extended Pandemic Unemployment Benefits: Effects on Unemployment and Labor Force Participation. This article examines whether recovery from the Great Recession and the COVID Recession is hampered by the extended unemployment benefits provided. It assesses whether workers are disincentivized to rejoin the workforce.



In the article, Cody showcases his proficient analytical skills and his ability to articulate complicated statistical data in a manner average readers can comprehend. Many articles are presented to this journal for publication but only a select few make the cut. We applaud Cody's incredible accomplishments as he continues his graduate studies.
