NOVEMBER HIGHLIGHTS





Congratulations Antioch! As mentioned in the October 2023 Connection, Antioch team members identified invasives that are affecting the existing tree canopy near the church sanctuary. Audubon awarded mini-grants to ten home owner associations (HOAs) and faith communities in October. This grant, given by Fairfax County Tree Preservation and Planting to Audubon at Home and Plant NOVA Natives to fund these mini-grants, requires a \$1,500 match being satisfied by either money or volunteer labor. Join us in congratulating Antioch Baptist Church on being awarded an Audubon at Home and Plant NOVA Natives \$3,000 mini-grant for removal of invasive plants.
