I want to personally thank you for your overwhelming support to help families and communities that experienced catastrophic damages due to Hurricanes Helene and Milton. Because of your generosity, we have been able to send \$20,000 to organizations and missions' partner to meet needs in Florida and North Carolina.

- \$10,000 to Beulah Baptist Institutional Church in Tampa, Florida, where one of our very own, Pastor Alan Harris, serves as Senior Pastor.
- \$5,000 to World Vision (North Carolina relief)
- \$5,000 to Lott Carey (North Carolina relief), our newest mission partner, which focuses on helping people in underserved areas often overlooked after natural disasters.

As we continue in this season of budget planning, we depend on the faithfulness and generosity of Antioch FFX members via God's tithes and our offerings. Your financial gifts and acts of charity allow us to serve and make a difference, both here and around the world. We are grateful for your ongoing dedication, knowing that it enables us to carry out God's work effectively.



As a follower of Christ, we must answer the call to evangelize and participate in the harvest. Every believer must remember that Christ has placed us in a field of souls ready for the harvest—a harvest that is both local and global in reach. Pastor Taylor has reminded us: that giving isn't just financial. We should also give our time to our church and our community. "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few" underscores the urgency of active participation in the work of God and sharing the gospel with the unbelieving world.

Our work is not done. According to author Joel Ryan, to become an effective laborer and actively participate in the Lord's harvest, we must:

- Make ourselves available to the Lord's call and be obedient to go and do the work wherever the Lord leads. (<u>Isaiah 6:8</u>)
- Never be ashamed of the gospel (Romans 1:16) but always eager to share the saving message of the cross wherever opportunities can be found.
- Be bold and courageous in our work, knowing we are being sent into the world as sheep among wolves. (Luke 10:3)
- Be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks for the reason we
 have hope in Jesus Christ— treating everyone with gentleness and respect. (<u>1 Peter 3:15</u>)
- Be patient and perseverant in our work— enduring hardship even in the difficult seasons of ministry. (2 Timothy 4:5).
- Be faithful ambassadors of Jesus Christ— the Lord of the harvest, who called and sent us into the field. (2 Corinthians 5:20)
- Be more concerned with winning the approval of God than man. (2 Timothy 2:15).

We must be active and faithful in prayer; praying for the harvest to come and for workers who will seek and save the lost. What are your spiritual gifts and how can they be used at Antioch? Which mission best suits you?






- Distribute boxes on Monday, November 25th from 11:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.


