Why is digital mapping so important?


It's essential to digitize your cemetery or crematory maps for 3 reasons:

#1 Protecting Cemetery & Crematory Records

From fires, floods and any other natural disaster... record protection is vital to preserving the history of the cemetery, whilst also ensuring your cemetery is operating efficiently. Lake Park Cemetery, New Jersey, found themselves amidst a crisis back in April 2016, when a suspicious fire destroyed the office building, along with thousands of paper burial records and locations. 140 years' worth of records gone overnight, a frightening predicament for any cemetery or crematory manager. Unfortunately, these essential records and maps weren't backed up and with the fire everything was lost.


For cemeteries all over the world, protecting old historical records and ensuring the history of the cemetery is preserved for future generations is a must! Storing records and maps in the cloud will eliminate this risk as files can be accessed from any mobile device, at any time via secure login.




#2 Accuracy:

Another week, another lawsuit!



It's not uncommon to hear that cemeteries throughout the world have been faced with million dollar lawsuits as a result of avoidable mistakes and people being buried in the wrong plots. Back in 2011, two sisters sued Rosehill Cemetery in Linden for \$25 million when they discovered, due to an administrative error, the grave they had been visiting for 20 years was not their mother's but contained the remains of a stranger. Using digital mapping (of the right kind!) can ensure accuracy and new technology can pinpoint exact locations which will not only give you peace of mind but can reduce the time spent on menial tasks of locating plots using old paper maps significantly.



#3 Increase Pre-Need Sales

Yes, we said it. Great digital mapping can increase revenue! To get the best sales potential, you need to invest in the best tools and cemetery management system. Good technology will show you inventory in real time, eliminating the potential for a duplicate sale or confusion over inventory availability. 5 Signs You Should Upgrade Your Cemetery Maps

Is it time to upgrade your cemetery mapping system? Preservation issues, human error, inaccuracies... the list goes on! Let's take a look at 5 top mapping issues being experienced by cemeterians, and assess the potential impact these can have on your cemetery.

#1 Preservation Issues

If your current map is just on paper you'll find yourself facing the problem that you might lose records. We've seen all the horror stories about natural disasters, fires, floods, water damage, maps being completely lost or missing because something happened to them! Without digitally updateable maps you're at risk of losing data!



#2 Human Error

If you're still depending on someone colouring in a paper map to show whether plots are available or on hold, it's time to make a change! We're all humans and as such we all make mistakes. Simple human error could lead to selling a plot twice and you don't want that!

We recently came across an article of a heart breaking story in Fresno, California where a couple had lost a young baby and they purchased the plot right next to the child for future use and changed this in the system. However, the person who sold the plot forgot to colour in the map originally and it had actually already been sold! This was heart breaking for the family – they had just faced the worst experience of the lives and that cemetery contributed to their pain by adding more trauma due to their processes being open to error. #3 Inaccuracies

Things change over time and quite often we know of inaccuracies in our maps simply because we've worked in the cemetery for so many years it's ingrained in our minds, and sometimes we don't know that the maps are inaccurate until it's too late. For example, the map shows a plot but on the ground there's actually not enough room for that plot. Perhaps there was never enough space or perhaps over time, neighbouring burials were incorrectly placed meaning the plot no longer exists. Inaccuracies can lead to wrong burials, disappointed families and lawsuits.

#4 Are your maps geographically correct?


Do you know if your map is geographically correct? Geographic location refers to a position on earth. Your absolute geographic location is defined by two coordinates, longitude and latitude. These two coordinates can be used to give specific and accurate locations of your cemetery plots. You can have a paper map or digital representation of your map on a screen.

However, it's important to know if your map is geographically correct as you're risking inefficiencies in your mapping process. Furthermore, if your maps aren't geographically correct you'll not be able to benefit from all the tools available to you and the public by being able to direct people accurately to a location.

#5 Is your information shareable and editable?


Is your inventory and maps updated in real time? Are all of your sales staff seeing the status of a plot as soon as it changes? When maps aren't visible and shareable, you are, once again, at risk of mistakes like the ones we previously mentioned which resulted in unwanted headlines!

As well as this, you're limiting the potential of your cemetery.
