What is kinship care?

Kinship care describes when relatives or family friends, who are not a child's birth parents, step in as the child's primary caregiver, such as grandparents, aunts/uncles, siblings, family friends and others who are already connected with the child.

How we started

KCC was founded by Dr. Angela Tobin, OTD at height of the COVID-19 pandemic in June 2020. Angela was inspired by her own family's experiences with kinship care and started KCC as a graduate student. It is the first online statewide support group for kinship caregivers in Ohio.
