#### Psalm 8

<sup>1</sup> O LORD, our Sovereign, how majestic is your name in all the earth!

You have set your glory above the heavens.

- Out of the mouths of babes and infants you have founded a bulwark because of your foes, to silence the enemy and the avenger.
- <sup>3</sup> When I look at your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars that you have established;
- <sup>4</sup> what are human beings that you are mindful of them, mortals that you care for them?

- <sup>5</sup> Yet you have made them a little lower than God, and crowned them with glory and honour.
- <sup>6</sup> You have given them dominion over the works of your hands; you have put all things under their feet,
- 7 all sheep and oxen, and also the beasts of the field,

#### Romans 5:1-11

- 5Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, <sup>2</sup>through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God. <sup>3</sup>And not only that, but we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, <sup>4</sup>and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, <sup>5</sup>and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.
- 6 For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. <sup>7</sup>Indeed, rarely will anyone die for a righteous person—though perhaps for a good person someone might actually dare to die. <sup>8</sup>But God proves his love for us in that while we still were sinners Christ died for us. <sup>9</sup>Much more surely then, now that we have been justified by his blood, will we be saved through him from the wrath of God. <sup>10</sup>For if while we were enemies, we were reconciled to God through the death of his Son, much more surely, having been reconciled, will we be saved by his life. <sup>11</sup>But more than that, we even boast in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation.

12 'I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. <sup>13</sup>When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth; for he will not speak on his own, but will speak whatever he hears, and he will declare to you the things that are to come. <sup>14</sup>He will glorify me, because he will take what is mine and declare it to you. <sup>15</sup>All that the Father has is mine. For this reason I said that he will take what is mine and declare it to you. Amen.
