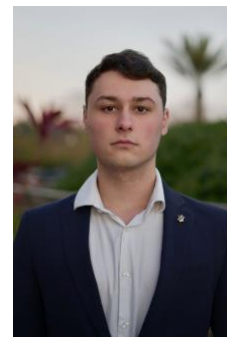

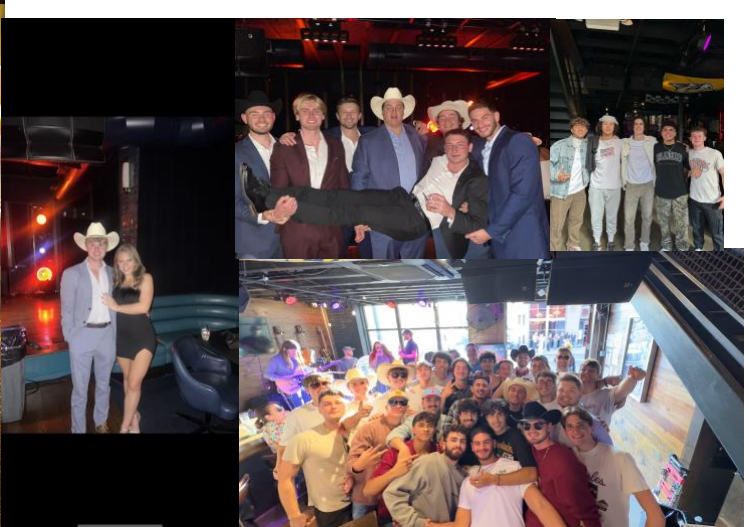


New Member Spotlight
