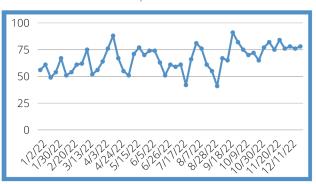

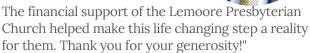
COMMUNITY GARDEN

In October we hosted a Trunk or Treat for the neighborhood! Lots of people came from our church and from the community, and everyone had a great time.

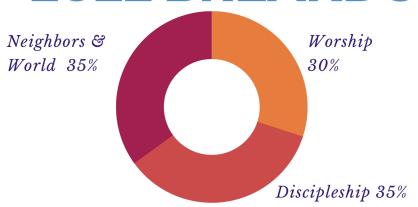

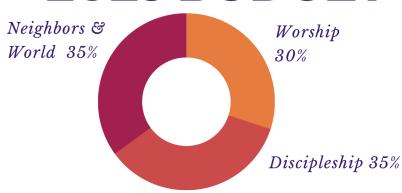

ANNUAL REPORT - CLERK OF SESSION

During 2022 Session conducted eight Regular Meetings plus one Joint Meeting with the Board of Deacons as called for in the Book of Order. The Pastor was on Sabbatical from 26 June to 2 October. There was only one meeting during the Pastor's Sabbatical. The October Meeting was conducted with the Rev. Pat Sheahan serving as Moderator. There were no Called Meetings. There were four email votes taken during the year. This year it was possible for Elders to attend the meetings and join in the discussions and make their votes electronically via ZOOM link-up.

Four Special Collections were authorized for 2022. (1.) One Great Hour of Sharing, (2.) Pentecost (3.) Peace and Global Witness and (4) Christmas Joy.

Annual Congregational Meetings were conducted in February and December.

The emphasis during the year focused on developing and refining the Ministry Roadmap which is a three part program of (1.) Mission-To form followers of Jesus, (2.) Vision-to see the faith flourish in families and (3.) Strategy- to and through families. The four avenues of the program consist of (1.) Family Worship, (2.) Family Discipleship, (3.) Family for our Neighbors and (4.) Family for the World.
