REPORTS

CLERK OF SESSION

During 2019 session conducted ten regular meetings and one annual combined Meeting with the Board of Deacons. There were no Called or Special meetings but there were four items voted upon by email vote. In order for an email to pass it must be a unanimous affirmative vote.

Session committee and chairpersons for 2019 were: Worship: (Ch.) Linda Beyersdorf, Fellowship: Pepper Jay (Ch.) and Chelsa Hawk-Wildes, Stewardship/Finance: (Ch.) Jay Salyer, Stewardship/Facilities: (Ch.) Riley Jones, Missions (Ch.) Shaina Mackey, Discipleship (Ch.) Pepper Jay. Ministry/Deacon's Liaison: (Ch.) Dawn Perkins. Other committees and assignments were Financial Secretary: Rotating, Personnel: Jay Salyer and Jim Clark, Nominations: Charlie Ennes (Ch.) and Chelsa Hawk-Wildes, Presbytery Delegate: Jim Clark, Health and Safety: Kim Morrell (Ch.) Jay Salyer and Riley Jones.

Personnel changes for the year included the hiring of Aubrey Bisher as part time Family Ministry Coordinator to assist Pastor Dave with Mission Activities within the church. On the down side our long time beloved Choir Director Mary Ellen Foote resigned. Under her direction and guidance through the years the choir went from an average participation of 4 to 6 voices each week to 13 to 17 voices each Sunday. Session is now working on a job description and advertising for a new Choir Director.

Special offerings authorized for 2019 were One Great Hour of Sharing, Pentecost Offering, for children at risk, Peace and Global Witness, Christmas Joy and Lemoore Sober Graduation.

There were several major actions approved by Session. The first was demolition of the small house at 232 "B" Street. Prior to demolition the windows were removed and some placed in the Pre School Building, others were donated to Habitat for Humanity. The second was adopting the Presbytery of San Joaquin's Safe Church Policy: Sexual Misconduct, Prevention and Mandated Reporting and Presbytery of San Joaquin Child/Youth/Vulnerable Adult Protection Policy and its Procedures. Session is now weighing how we can participate in The Presbytery of San Joaquin's 2020 New Worshipping Communities Program .Presbytery is requesting a contribution of \$30,000.00 over the next three years from our congregation.

STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE

The Stewardship Committee was composed of four subcommittees: Finance, Buildings & Grounds, Health & Safety, and Stewardship.

The **Finance Sub-Committee**, monitors the Church's investments, income, and expenses on a monthly and quarterly basis and advises the staff, officers, and Session on matters involving the budget and investments. It is also tasked with developing the annual budget that is adopted by the congregation.

Year 2019 was a typically interesting year for the Church's finances. It was both a year of generous contributions and a year of restraint in the operations of the Church. The Church's income was again higher this year than any in history. Though we've made large commitments in our benevolences, they were more than offset by your generosity. Matched to the greater income were reasonable expenditures under Operations and Plant Maintenance. Our committee chairs and staff did a great job of keeping costs down. Thankfully, the costs of utilities and typical maintenance contributed positively to the expenses story. On a percentage basis, we did see a large increase in our property tax this year because the razing of our classroom house put the property back on the tax rolls. Keeping with the Session's desire to use some of our substantial reserves on mission and benevolences, the Church again contributed substantially to new worshiping Presbyterian communities and supporting the Corcoran Presbyterian Church.

The 2020 Budget reflects the generosity of our members in 2019 as well as our desire to continue our support of our nascent and developing local Presbyterian churches. On the Personnel side, Pastor Dave received a 1.6% raise while our Church Secretary/Organist received the same 1.6% reflecting the Presbytery's suggested costof-living increase. The nursery staff and gardener were provided with raises this year, too. We changed the look of the Other Expenses page of the Budget this year. Under Operating Expenses/Ministry, the first ten lines represent the line items for the ten standing Session committees. Many of the lines are newly created this year. Though there is an assigned allocation to each committee, there may be other line items available to them within the Budget depending on their responsibilities. The Family Ministry line was created as the budget line for the new Family Minister Coordinator. Under Plant Maintenance, relatively minor repairs are anticipated this year. Utilities were increased due to an expected increase in after-hours activity in our facilities including the Assemble program. For property tax, we expect an increase due to the razing of the building across the parking lot and the loss of the religious exemption on that property. On the income side this year, we still anticipate generous financial support for our church from our fellow congregants. We have created the Benevolence line to account for our members' generosity in the support of the broader Church. Thank you for your love of God and your love of this church family.

The **Health & Safety-Committee** was established to look out for the physical welfare of our congregation.

As a backdrop for our establishment, over the last few years, churches throughout the United States have experienced a sizeable increase in violence. It is our prayer and the goal of our committee that we will never experience violence in our church. This

Church is a welcoming church and that will not change. We want to welcome all who want to worship God among the family of believers. It is our responsibility to be welcoming yet aware of human behavior and interact with those who have other priorities early and away from the congregation for their safety and the congregation's. We continue to receive training on many aspects of Church safety.

Over this past year, we met with two members of the Lemoore Police Department's Pop Team (Problem Oriented Policing) and reviewed with them our facilities and our committee's priorities. The church has begun installing electronic door locks that will help staff control who has access to the facilities. We added two more volunteers last year to the Committee, and we hope to add more in this year. We conducted a training for our committee members in First Aid, CPR and the use of an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) in November.

In 2019, we were able to intervene when one of our members became incapacitated. In addition, we had six visits from two members of our community that we monitored because of unusual conversations or behaviors. One individual had the potential of being disruptive and made several members of our congregation uncomfortable. So far, we've been able to provide him opportunities to "worship" with us in a fashion that he and the congregation could be comfortable. I would ask all members of congregation to notify the Health and Safety team members if they notice anything out of the ordinary so we may look into the situation.

In addition to the more interesting services we provide the Church, we're also able to assist parishioners accessing and leaving the facilities. We watch traffic for those crossing the street, keep an eye on the kids and nursery, and ensure the playground is safe for the Junior Church kids when they're released to go outside and play. Also, we've been known to pass out programs before church.

2019 was a lighter year for the **Buildings & Grounds Sub-Committee**. Two large projects undertaken for 2019 were the painting of Fellowship Hall and the removal of the classroom house next to the parking lot. Fortunately, the Church has a capital improvement account that allow us to take on large projects. For 2020, we'll be installing official exits signs around the facilities and complete the re-locking of the entrance doors. On the repair side, it appears there is a roof leak in the Kitchen that will need to be addressed soon.

I look forward to walking with you in faith throughout this year. If you have a need or an idea that we can address, let us know. Our Church is stronger when we can work together as a congregation of believers.

MISSION COMMITTEE

MISSION: "The proclamation of the gospel for the salvation of humankind."

PURPOSE: To share the good news of Jesus with people beyond our church family through 1) relational evangelism, 2) compassionate service, and to support individuals and organizations who do the same locally and globally.

RESPONSIBILITIES

Form a committee that represents the diverse membership of the church:

This year we formed a mission committee that includes two elders and 5 members that meet once a month to prayerfully and purposefully discuss our goals and seek opportunities for our church. We also started a DVD study called <u>Poverty Cure</u> that aims to educate in how to effectively help the poor. Members include Shaina Mackey, Charlie Ennes, Anne Reinhart, Sylvia Huntington, Christian Bisher, Jean Knudson and Elaine Boyd.

Create opportunities for LPC and its members to build relationships with people beyond our won church family:

The Lemoore After School Student Outreach (LASSO) Program has started its 3rd year this fall. We consistently serve about 8-10 students from Liberty Middle School and provide them food, fun educational opportunities, and fellowship. This fall we are offering an art class and a safety/self-defense class. They also have opportunities to meet community leaders with visits from our Lemoore Police Department and a local Martial Arts instructor. Volunteers from our congregation make the program possible by teaching classes, providing transportation, making snacks and much more This was the first year we had a group sponsor a table at Liberty's Family Fall Festival which helped raise awareness about the program to the community. We also offered to find sponsors to help LASSO student attend Calvin Crest Summer Camp.

Create opportunities for all ages to serve the poor in our community & beyond:

LPC consistently supports Living Water World Mission and had a few members from our church go abroad this year. Moreover, we had our first experience serving at the Hanford Soup Kitchen. There were about 10 volunteers from the church and we served about 140 people, as well as deep cleaning and reorganized their pantry. There are plans to serve again late November and the intention is to start volunteering every other month in 2020. Personally, I can attest to the JOY that was found in serving that day. Less than 24 hours after the volunteer event, the youngest volunteer, Asher Jay, was requesting to go back again the next weekend. This is a huge opportunity for LPC to work in our community. Our goal for the holidays is to assist the 11th Annual Community Christmas Dinner in Lemoore. Their mission is to serve everyone in Lemoore for one meal and provide presents for the children that attend. It's a great way to reach out to our community and serve, and we are hoping to assist with cooking, serving and assembling gifts.

Increase awareness of local and global mission opportunities through minutes for mission, visits from missionaries and/or mission organization, etc.

The mission committee has made an effort to provide several opportunities to hear from other missionaries in the community and abroad. We have had/will have:

Revs. Greg & Chris Callison: PCUSA Ministers in partnership with The Assembly
of the National Evangelical Presbyterian Churches in Iraq.

- Elizabeth Prasa: Witnessing Ministries of Christ that serves in India
- Donated \$500 to FIRM's 25th Anniversary Fundraiser which purchased 5 seats to the event.
- Jeff & Christi Boyd with the PCUSA Mission Co-workers in the Democratic Republic of the Congo.
- Melody Downie-Dack with Living Water World Mission

We also hope to look for mission opportunities locally. While travelling abroad as missionaries is a wonderful experience, there is a lot of NEED in our community locally. After finishing our educational series <u>Poverty Cure</u> to become more educated about helping the poor, we hope to launch a new opportunity to serve in 2020.

WORSHIP COMMITTEE

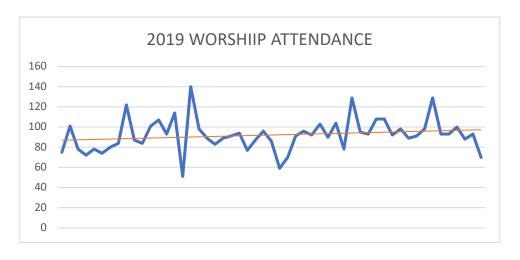

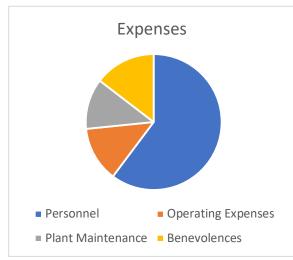

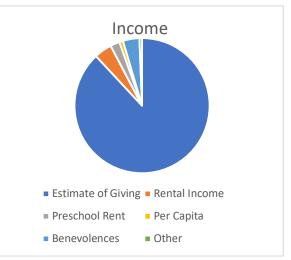

CARE & COMPASSION

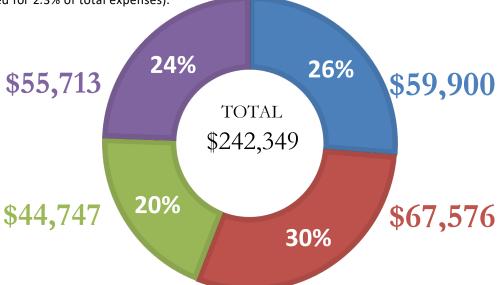
Care & Compassion is how we show God's love to those in need, both within our church and beyond our walls.

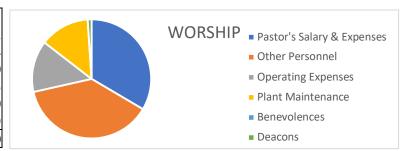

Discipleship is how we learn to follow Jesus together.

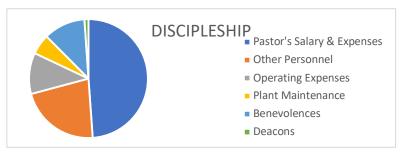
