

WEEK 1: INTRODUCTION

THE DETAILS

- Final book of the Pentateuch ("five books"), which are God's word to us.
 - Genesis = prenatal word of God
 - Exodus = birth and infancy
 - Leviticus = childhood
 - Numbers = adolescence
 - Deuteronomy = adulthood; ready to receive Promised Land
- Name is Greek for "second law" a second law-giving by Moses
- Moses is listed as author, but likely a group of writers post-exile (6th century BCE)

THE STYLE

- Combination of narrative, exhortation, and law
 - o Narrative: Deut. begins and ends with the story of Moses and Israel
 - Exhortation: contains speeches by Moses asking Israel to obey
 - o Law: contains the 10 Commandments plus additional laws & instructions

THE CHARACTER

- Not just a law code, but a farewell address by Moses and <u>an invitation to choose</u> life vs. death and blessing vs. curse.
- A plea to love God: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart" (6:5, the Shema)
- A plea to obey: "Follow [the laws] so that you may live..." (4:1)
