

WEEK 7: Laws for Matters of Life and Death DEUTERONOMY 19-21

CHAPTER 19

- Bottom Line: no shedding of innocent blood.
- Accidental and intentional homicide—19:1-13
 - Set apart three cities of refuge (more as Israel grows)
 - o Example of accidental homicide: "without having hated him."
 - "Lest innocent blood be shed in your land" (v. 10)
 - o Example of intentional homicide/murder—city of refuge will extradite.
 - o "Purge the guilt of innocent blood that it may go well with you." (v. 13)
- Laws concerning witnesses 19:15-21
 - o Two or three witnesses required.
 - False witnesses punished in kind.
 - o "Eye for an eye" was meant for false witnesses, not a general rule!

CHAPTER 20

- Bottom Line: there are limits to the kind of warfare God condones.
- Preparation for war—20:1-9
 - o Do not be afraid, but remember God's deliverance from Egypt.
 - o God gives the victory (v. 4).
 - Weed out the fearful and the potentially tragic (vv. 5-9).
- Engagement in war—20:10-20
 - o Offer peace first (v. 10).
 - o Distant cities: kill males only, keep the rest.
 - o Promised Land cities: "save alive nothing that breathes" (v. 16). Rationale: "that they may not teach you all their abominable practices" (v. 18).
 - Besiege people, not trees (food supply) (vv. 19-20).

CHAPTER 21

- Bottom Line: avoid evil & guilt and treat people fairly.
- Atonement for unsolved murders—21:1-9
 - Nearest city shall make an atoning sacrifice for the murder.
 - o "Purge the guilt of innocent blood from your midst" (v. 9).
- Marrying female captives 21:10-14
 - Implied that the captives are from distant cities, since marrying Canaanites was forbidden.

- o Time of mourning provided.
- o Beauty "removed" possibly to prevent rushing into a marriage.
- o Once married, she is given full rights and status in Israel.
- o If no longer "delighted in," she can go free (protects her dignity).
- Rights of the firstborn—21:15-17
 - o No partiality or preference based on emotion.
- A Rebellious Son 21:18-21
 - Not for all rebellious sons, but for those who rebelled <u>despite</u> parental discipline.
 - o "A glutton and a drunkard" is what the leaders called Jesus (Mt 11:19). It was code for "He deserves death!"
 - "Purge the evil from your midst."
- A hanged man is cursed by God—21:22-23
 - o Hanging seems to be optional as necessary.
 - o Bury him the same day.
 - o Rationale: a hanged man is cursed (see Gal 3) and it would defile the land.
