Who can say the five vowel sounds? Today we will learn a second sound for the vowels. Each vowel can also say /ŭ/. Look at the words on the board. Point to *some*. What is this word? What vowel sound do you hear? Which letter makes the /ŭ/ sound? Underline the o.


Follow the same procedure for was (a), the (e), run (u), robin (i)

Each of the vowels have the /ŭ/ sound. When any vowel makes the /ŭ/ sound we show this with an upside down e. (a) Demonstrate on the board. This is called a schwa. It is not a letter, but a way to show when any vowel makes the /ŭ/ sound. This is the way dictionaries show the /ŭ/ sound. Students do not need to learn how to write the schwa symbol.

Go back to the word *some* on the board. Following *some*, write same. Since the letter o has the /ŭ/ sound, *some* sounds like this, same. Demonstrate in the same way for the rest of the words. run - ran, was - was, robin - roban.
