Also in April we begin the process of applying for the many different grants available to us from the Elks National Foundation's Community Investment Program. Finally, I want to give a huge thank you to all who contributed this past year at our Portland Elks lodge in some way or another. Without you, we could not be who we are or continue to be in the upcoming year. I sincerely appreciate the many contributions in thoughts and ideas from the members and hope that we will continue to be a strong mother lodge for our state for years to come.


