At the November House Committee meeting several items were discussed that we need to remind all of our members of: signing in guests and behavior in the lounge and use of profanity.



As a reminder, all guests must be signed in by a member with their member number. And when the member leaves the lodge for the evening, their guest must leave with them. In addition, once the guest has been signed in more than six times in the calendar year, they will be given a membership application and asked to join. These rules are stated in our by-laws. You might ask, who keeps track of how many times a guest is signed in? As chair of the House Committee, it is my responsibility to monitor the guest registry book regularly. Over the past 18 months, numerous guests have now become regular members. If you have any question in this regard, you are welcome to attend a House Committee meeting, or I am typically at the lodge every Friday night and happen to answer any questions.



Items can be NEW or GENTLY USED.


Items donated DO NOT NEED TO BE WRAPPED! Just return the items and place them under the tree in the Lounge.
