We were able to secure a total of \$10,000 spread over 4 ENF grants which supported veterans, senior citizens, foster children and schools. We supported Wreaths across Summit Project, ENF, Scholarships, Drug Awareness, Hoop Shoot, Flag Day, Memorial Service, Mothers Day, Maine Children's Cancer Program, Veteran Home Care kits and many more. I am proud of what we as Elks can do to make our community a better place for those in need.



In addition, we have increased our membership from 456 as of 4/1/25 to the current membership total of 498. A huge thank you to all who have reached out to friends, family and acquaintances and invited them to join the best fraternal organization in the country. IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR Fiscal year April 1, 2026 – March 31, 2027



April 1, 2026 starts the beginning of Portland Elks Lodge 188's fiscal year. Before that date you will be receiving a notice from the Elks Grand Lodge reminding you about your dues for the new year. The letter breaks down what your dues covers and allows you to donate to ENF, MCCP, and Elks scholarship funds. Please DO NOT TEAR OFF the bottom of the form when you are submitting your dues payment.

If you want your 2026-2027 membership card mailed to you, please enclose a self-addressed stamped envelope, and when cards are ready, yours will be mailed to you.

If you are dropping off payment at Lodge 188, and I am not in the office, there is a beige metal mailbox outside of the Secretary's Office, and you can put your payment in it. Please remember to include the remittance form and put payment in an envelope, if possible, before dropping them in the mailbox.

One more request, when you fill out the payment form, PLEASE update any information that may have changed such as address, telephone number, email address, etc. There may be times when the Secretary's Office may need to contact someone on your behalf, so please add their names, address, phone number and relationship on a separate sheet (this request is not on the form the Grand Lodge sends). ACTIVITY COMMITTEE NEWS, Kim Toppi, Chair



As we close out the calendar year, it is always a good time to reflect back on the year and what was accomplished. The Activity Committee has a lot to be proud of for all that we did for our members, as well as the community.

This past year the Committee was able to secure three ENF grants, the Beacon Grant for \$4,000 and for the fourth year held a very successful School Supply Drive; the Spotlight Grant for \$2,000 and undertook a project to fill 100 Comfort Case backpacks for Adoptive & Foster Families of Maine, and the Gratitude Grant for \$3,000 and a food drive project which will be undertaken in February. And we held an impromptu food drive to support St Vincent de Paul Soup Kitchen this past holiday season.

The lounge got a fresh paint job using the Lounge Designated Fund, and just approved, a new dishwasher to be purchased and installed behind the Bar.

Our May Shopping Spree brought in shoppers on a Thursday night with 25 vendors present, as well as bourbon, beer and vodka tastings for shoppers.

The Trustees approved expenses for two Member Appreciation Events—the June BBQ and the most recent Christmas Celebration. This is just one way for our Lodge to thank members for their continued support throughout the year.

This year our Harvest Craft Fair topped \$10,000 for the first time and thanks to an amazing team of volunteers held another successful Chicken Pot Pie sale, and spent the week leading up to the Fair baking breads, cookies, cakes and making candy.

Our second Kid's Halloween Party proved to be a huge success! As was our Holiday Paint Nite where 35 participants all took home their creations, led by Paul Cyr. Yes, we'll do it again!

Wednesday and Friday nights continue to be popular for everyone who enjoys our card games.

Please save the date for our 1st Spring Basket Raffle fundraiser—Friday and Saturday, May 8-9. We made the decision to move this event away from the holidays and into the Spring—just in time for Mother's Day!

As we begin a new year, please continue to share ideas for the committee to consider.






Congratulations, and Happy Anniversary to Shirley and Ed Libby who celebrated their 50th anniversary on Saturday, December 27!




