## TIME TO ORDER A BRICK!

Our new fiscal year starts April 1, 2025. As of that date you need to have paid your dues for Fiscal Year 2024-2025 to come into Lodge #188 or any other Lodge you may visit.

Regular members' dues will be \$97.00 and Lifetime members' dues will be \$59.50. This is an increase of \$3.00 passed down from the Grand Lodge because of the increase in insurance costs.

You should begin to receive invoices from the Grand Lodge just like what you received in the mail last year. When you send and/or bring in your dues payment, please attach the entire invoice. One more reminder, if you want your card mailed, enclose a self-addressed, stamped envelope with your payment or add an extra \$5.00 to your payment.

We will also be adding the member dues form that we created to our monthly newsletter for your use if you should misplace the voucher sent by the Grand Lodge. You will notice that at the bottom of the page, there is space for you to add the name, address, and telephone number of a contact person. This is important because sometimes we need to get in touch with a family member on your behalf.

We still have 38 members who are delinquent. They will try be contacted one more time and if no luck, they will be dropped from the rolls of Portland Elks #188.

# THE NEW FISCAL YEAR STARTS APRIL 1, 2025

**REMINDER TO OUR MEMBERS**.....per the by-laws of Elks Lodge 188, a member may only sign in 2 guests on any given night, and the guests MUST leave when the member leaves who signed them in. The number of guests is limited so that the lounge can accommodate our members who pay dues annually. We cannot exceed the capacity allowed by City Fire Code, nor do we want to turn away members if too many guests are signed in.

#### WELCOME HOME KITS

As long as there are veterans, the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks will never forget them.

One of the ways we live up to this commitment is through our **Welcome Home Kits**, designed to assist veterans who are experiencing homelessness. These kits contain essential home supplies to help them get started in their new living space. Items typically include cleaning supplies, dishes, pots, pans, and laundry detergent. Some kits may include a bed if we stay within the guidelines of the kits.

When we are contacted about a veteran in need, our team reaches out to assess their specific needs. With the support of the **Elks National Foundation (ENF)**, we are able to provide these kits at no cost to the veterans. Importantly, there is no limit to the number of veterans we can assist, and we do not need to budget for this initiative. The lodge is reimbursed by **ENF** for monies used to make the purchase for these kits. Our team typically has one individual do the shopping, then submits the information to **ENF**.

Over the past month, our lodge has helped two veterans, each with unique needs. As we continue this effort, we will look to our members for support, particularly for items not covered by **ENF**.




