Maine Paws for Veterans is a non-profit corporation established as Embrace A Vet in 2012. Founded by the late Joy Johnson, Embrace A Vet

initially focused on retreats for veterans and spouses and later on service dog training for veterans with Post-Traumatic Stress. In

2021, Maine Paws for Veterans was established to provide service dog training and support for veterans with military-related Post-Traumatic Stress. Maine Paws for Veterans and Embrace A Vet have graduated approximately 130 teams of veterans and service dogs since 2012.

The Maine Paws for Veterans program matches qualified dogs with veterans living with military-related PTS. In this unique program, pairs progress through service dog training together, enriching both lives while building peer relationships.

On September 25, our Veteran's Committee presented a \$2,000 check as a result of Lodge 188 receiving the Gratitude Grant.

# ELK LEGACY SCHOLARSHIPS ....CHILDREN,

GRANDCHILDREN OF ELK MEMBERS ELIGIBLE TO APPLY

Legacy Awards are \$4,000 scholarships available to children and grandchildren of Elks members. **The 2025 contest and application IS NOW OPEN.** For the 2025 contest, any child or grandchild (or step-

child, step-grandchild, or legal ward) of a living Elk who joined the Order on or before April 1, 2022, is eligible to apply. The Elk must also be a paid-up member through March 31, 2025. Great-grandchildren are not eligible.

The applicant must be a high school senior. The applicant must apply online only. **The 2025 Legacy Awards application deadline is February 3, 2025, 2:59 pm ET.** 

You do not need to submit ACT and/or SAT scores. Legacy Awards may only be applied to accredited US American schools, colleges or universities.


