Dear Members and Officers,

Hoping that you all had a great summer. I am personally looking forward to some cooler weather and fall activities.

In last month's article, I indicated that the trustees have approved going forward with obtaining a quote for the installation of a kitchen hood. During our last membership meeting, the quote was approved by a majority of the members present. We are now in the process of preparing our application which will need to go to the Grand Lodge for final approval. The current kitchen hood was installed in our lodge sometime around 1969. Our event



center generates most of the income that our lodge needs to remain open and pay the operating bills. This replacement will ensure that we can continue to function as both a lodge and event center.

The Elks National Foundation was established back in 1928 by then president John Malley. To date, it has awarded over 500 million in grants to local lodges supporting charitable projects which benefit the community we live in. In our current fiscal year, our lodge has received the Spotlight grant for \$2,000 to support comfort cases for children entering foster care. And the Beacon grant was approved for \$4,000 to support the school supply drive. We are also eligible for the Gratitude grant of \$3,000 by meeting the Grand Lodge per capita giving per member last year. Please consider a donation to the Elks National Foundation by logging into the Elks.org website. Every dollar we donate comes back to us through these grants.

Lastly, I have ordered a sign to be installed in our parking lot. This will be reserved for one individual member who exemplifies the Elk's guiding principles of Charity, Justice, Brotherly Love and Fidelity or contributes positively towards serving the people in our community by demonstrating how Elks Care Elks Share.

Hoping to see you soon at the lodge.





IT'S BACK TO SCHOOL TIME
